[English, clutched, grabbed, seized, took hold of, griped, clasped, snatched, grappled, clenched, Opposite of, released]

- The concubine who was raped and killed in Benjamin's territory was then cut up by her master and a piece of her sent to all twelve tribes to magnify the injustice.
- Hence I grasped my concubine and cut her up and sent her into every field of Israel's inheritance, because they had carried on loose conduct and disgraceful folly in Israel. (Judges 20:6)
- Jesus disciples were slow tempest grasp that Jesus referred to the leaven of the Pharisees, their teachings.
- Then they grasped that he said to watch out, not for the leaven of the loaves, but for the teaching of the Pharisees and Sadducees. (Matthew 16:12)
- For they had not grasped the meaning of the loaves, but their hearts continued dull of understanding. (Mark 6:52)
