And against the Prince of princes he will stand up, but it will be without hand that he will be broken. (Daniel 8:25)
- And the thing seen concerning the evening and the morning, which has been said; it is true. And you, for your part, keep secret the vision, because it is yet for many days. (Daniel 8:26)
- And as for me, Daniel, I felt exhausted and was made sick for some days. Then I got up and did the work of the king, but I kept showing myself numbed on account of the thing seen, and there was nobody understanding it. (Daniel 8:27)

- In the first year of Darius the son of Ahasuerus of the seed of the Medes, who had been made king over the kingdom of the Chaldeans. (Daniel 9:1)
- In the first year of his reigning I myself, Daniel, discerned by the books the number of the years concerning which the word of Yehowah had occurred to Jeremiah the prophet, for fulfilling the devastations of Jerusalem, namely, seventy years. (Daniel 9:2)
- And a mighty king will certainly stand up and rule with extensive dominion and do according to his will. (Daniel 11:3)
- And when he will have stood up, his kingdom will be broken and be divided toward the four winds of the heavens, but not to his posterity and not according to his dominion with which he had ruled, because his kingdom will be uprooted, even for others than these. (Daniel 11:4)
- · Alexander the Great proved to be that conspicuous horn. Beginning in 334 B.C.E, he led a small, but well-disciplined Greek army, to one victory after another.
- With lightning speed he conquered Asia Minor, Syria, Palestine, Egypt, and the entire Medo-Persian Empire as far as India. But in just a few years Alexander was dead, and in a relatively short time his empire was split four ways, among four of his generals.
- The Grecian Empire was short-lived, but its effects were longlasting. Before his death, Alexander had introduced Greek culture and the Greek language into all parts of his domain.
- Common Greek became the lingua franca of many nationalities, and this later contributed to the rapid spread of Christianity throughout the Mediterranean area.
