[English, full-grown, grown-up, full-fledged, adult, developed, mature, Opposite of, immature]

- The complaint about the men of Sodom and Gomorrah had grown loud against them.
- For we are bringing this place to ruin, because the outcry against them has grown loud before Yehowah, so that Yehowah sent us to bring the city to ruin. (Genesis 19:13)
- Abimelech asked Isaac to move out of his territory because Isaac had grown far stronger than he was.
- Finally Abimelech said to Isaac; Move from our neighborhood, because you have grown far stronger than we are. (Genesis 26:16)
- When Tamar saw that Shelah had grown up and had not been given to her to raise up offspring for her.
- With that she removed the garments of her widowhood from her and covered herself with a shawl and veiled herself and sat down at the entrance of Enaim, which is along the road to Timnah. For she saw that Shelah had grown up and yet she had not been given as a wife to him. (Genesis 38:14)
- If the plague of leprosy had grown dull upon inspection of it, the priest must pronounce the man clean.
- And the priest must look at him on the seventh day the second time, and if the plague has grown dull and the plague has not spread in the skin, the priest must also pronounce him clean. It was a scab. And he must wash his garments and be clean. (Leviticus 13:6)
- But if in its look the abnormal falling off of hair has stood and black hair has grown in it, the abnormal falling off of hair has been healed. He is clean, and the priest must pronounce him clean. (Leviticus 13:37)

- When Israel entered the Promised Land they grew fat and forgot their God Yehowah.
- When Jeshurun began to grow fat, then he kicked. You have grown fat, you have become thick, you have become gorged. So he forsook God, who made him, and despised the Rock of his salvation. (Deuteronomy 32:15)
- When Moses died at 120 years of age, his eyes had not grown dim.
- And Moses was a hundred and twenty years old at his death. His eye had not grown dim, and his vital strength had not fled. (Deuteronomy 34:7)
- Joshua was told that all the inhabitants of Canaan had grown disheartened by Israel's presence.
- And they went on to say to Joshua; Yehowah has given all the land into our hand. Consequently all the inhabitants of the land have also grown disheartened because of us. (Joshua 2:24)
- When Joshua had grown old Yehowah told him that much of the Promised Land still was to be taken as a possession by Israel.
- Now Joshua was old, being advanced in years. So Yehowah said to him; You yourself have grown old and have advanced in years, and to a very great extent the land yet remains to be taken in possession. (Joshua 13:1)
- When the Israelites had grown strong they put the Canaanites to forced labor.
- And it turned out that when the sons of Israel had grown strong, they went putting the Canaanites at forced labor, and they did not dispossess them entirely. (Joshua 17:13)
- Joshua called the older men of Israel to himself when he had grown old, to bear witness to them.
- That Joshua proceeded to call all Israel, its older men and its heads and its judges and its officers, and to say to them; As for me, I have grown old, I have advanced in days. (Joshua 23:2)

- Naomi told her daughters to return to their homeland for she had grown too old to have a husband.
- Return, my daughters, go, for I have grown too old to get to belong to a husband. If I had said I had hope also that I should certainly become a husband's tonight and also should certainly bear sons. (Ruth 1:12)
- When Samuel had grown old he appointed his sons to judge Israel, but his sons did not follow his way.
- And it came about that as soon as Samuel had grown old he made appointments of his sons as judges for Israel. (1 Samuel 8:1)
- And said to him; Look! You yourself have grown old, but your own sons have not walked in your ways. Now do appoint for us a king to judge us like all the nations. (1 Samuel 8:5)
- Saul continued like one grown speechless when good-for-nothing men refused to follow after his kingship.
- As for the good-for-nothing men, they said; How will this one save us? Accordingly they despised him, and they did not bring any gift to him. But he continued like one grown speechless. (1 Samuel 10:27)
- Samuel, upon growing old and gray, witnessed that he had walked uprightly before Israel all his days.
- And now here is the king walking before you! As for me, I have grown old and gray, and my sons, here they are with you, and I, I have walked before you from my youth until this day. (1 Samuel 12:2)
- Rehoboam preferred to listen to the counsel of the men that he had grown up with, rather than older and wiser ones.
- However, he left the counsel of the older men with which they had advised him, and he began to take counsel with the young men that had grown up with him, who were the ones attending upon him. (1 Kings 12:8)
- In turn the young men that had grown up with him spoke to him,

saying; This is what you should say to this people who have spoken to you, saying; Your father, for his part, made our yoke heavy, but, as for you, make it lighter upon us, this is what you should speak to them; My little finger itself will certainly be thicker than my father's hips. (1 Kings 12:10)

- However, he left the counsel of the older men with which they had advised him, and he began to take counsel with the young men that had grown up with him, who were the ones attending upon him. (2 Chronicles 10:8)
- In turn the young men that had grown up with him spoke with him, saying; This is what you should say to the people who have spoken to you, saying; Your father, for his part, made our yoke heavy, but, as for you, make it lighter upon us, this is what you should say to them; My own little finger will certainly be thicker than my father's hips. (2 Chronicles 10:10)
- When David had grown old he appointed Solomon to rule after him.
- And David himself had grown old and satisfied with days, and so he made Solomon his son king over Israel. (1 Chronicles 23:1)
- Ezra confessed that the sin of his people Israel had grown great, even up to the heavens.
- And I went on to say; O my God, I do feel ashamed and embarrassed to raise my face to you, O my God, for our errors themselves have multiplied over our head and our guiltiness has grown great even to the heavens. (Ezra 9:6)
- Nehemiah closed the gates of Jerusalem as soon as the light had grown shadowy before the Sabbath.
- And it came about that, as soon as the gates of Jerusalem had grown shadowy before the Sabbath, I immediately said the word and the doors began to be closed. I said further that they should not open them until after the Sabbath, and some of my own attendants I stationed at the gates that no burden might come in on the Sabbath day. (Nehemiah 13:19)
- Job asked why the wicked ones had grown old, become superior in wealth, and yet they kept living.

- Why is it that the wicked themselves keep living, have grown old, also have become superior in wealth? (Job 21:7)
- The anger of Yehowah God had grown hot listening to the wrong counsel of Job's three troublesome comforters, for they had not spoken the truth, as Job had.
- And it came about after Yehowah had spoken these words to Job, that Yehowah proceeded to say to Eliphaz the Temanite. My anger has grown hot against you and your two companions, for you men have not spoken concerning me what is truthful as has my servant Job. (Job 42:7)
- The Psalmist showed that he had grown weary with his sighing and his tears.
- I have grown weary with my sighing, all night long I make my couch swim, with my tears I make my own divan overflow.

 (Psalms 6:6)
- The Psalmist showed that his eye had grown old, because of all those showing hostility toward him.
- From vexation my eye has become weak, it has grown old because of all those showing hostility to me. (Psalms 6:7)
- David confessed that though he had now grown old, he never saw a righteous man left entirely, nor one forced to go begging for bread.
- A young man I used to be, I have also grown old, and yet I have not seen anyone righteous left entirely, nor his offspring looking for bread. (Psalms 37:25)
- The Psalmist showed that he had grown numb due to the groaning of his own heart.
- I have grown numb and become crushed to an extreme degree. I have roared due to the groaning of my heart. (Psalms 38:8)
- The Psalmist showed that his soul had grown faint in longing for his God.

- O God, you are my God, I keep looking for you. My soul does thirst for you. For you my flesh has grown faint with longing In a land dry and exhausted, where there is no water. (Psalms 63:1)
- The Psalmist showed that he had grown emaciated and was like a bird isolated upon a roof.
- I have grown emaciated, and I am become like a bird isolated upon a roof. (Psalms 102:7)
- The Psalmist showed that his knees swayed from fasting, and his flesh had grown lean.
- My knees themselves have swayed from fasting, and my very flesh has grown lean, without any oil. (Psalms 109:24)
- The foreigners say that their sons are like little plants grown up in their youth.
- Who say; Our sons are like little plants grown up in their youth, our daughters like corners carved in palace style. (Psalms 144:12)
- The congregator told his son not to despise a mother just because she had grown old.
- Listen to your father who caused your birth, and do not despise your mother just because she has grown old. (Proverbs 23:22)
- Would you think that Yehowah would strike against his own people, if they stopped listening to him and rebelled? He has done so twice in the past first in 607 B.C.E. and again in 70 C.E. In both instances he brought the worldly nations up against his people and humiliated them.
- These nations, the mountains will be agitated against all religion with the aim to rid the earth of it. He will not show compassion for his people, for they are rebellious and arrogant and they refuse to carry out his will. They will die in the streets with no helper.
- That is why the anger of Yehowah has grown hot against his people, and he will stretch out his hand against them and strike them. And the mountains will be agitated, and their dead bodies will become like the offal in the midst of the streets. In view of

all this his anger has not turned back, but his hand is stretched out still. (Isaiah 5:25)

- Like the growling of the sea in a storm, which makes a great uproar, but accomplishes nothing, the nations will growl over their victory, but it will be an empty one for they will have accomplished nothing. Once religion is destroyed, there will be no light of understanding, no hope, for most people will simply go along with the nations, not realizing why their God stood off from them in their time of distress.
- And they will growl over it in that day as with the growling of the sea. And one will actually gaze at the land, and, look! There is distressing darkness, and even the light has grown dark because of the drops falling on it. (Isaiah 5:30)
- However, Israel has lost their delight in recounting the glory of their God. They have grown tired of his service, they do not want to call upon him, they have grown weary of serving him, the waters of truth they take for granted.
- But you have not called even me, O Jacob, because you have grown weary of me, O Israel. (Isaiah 43:22)
- spiritual understanding, due to the many ideas presented to them. Since they have no clear direction from Yehowah, they have grown weary of hearing new things, and so they reject them all. Her counselors all try to tell her what is to come in upon her in the future, but none of them are seeing the truth. They are all like men who are looking to higher ones for understanding, but the highest one Yehowah, has closed them off from his divine light.
- You have grown weary with the multitude of your counselors. Let them stand up, now, and save you, the worshipers of the heavens, the lookers at the stars, those giving out knowledge at the new moons concerning the things that will come upon you. (Isaiah 47:13)
- In a multitude of ways she has toiled to bring men in to her bed to worship her. She has done this through her central control of the Elder arrangement, by doling out parts and special privileges, by bestowing titles, by Bethel family participation.

- She has not yet seen the spiritual folly of her actions. And so she has not said; It is hopeless. She keeps multiplying titles and giving out prominence, so that men will keep coming to her bed of love's expressions.
- In the multitude of your ways you have toiled. You have not said; It is hopeless! You have found a revival of your own power. That is why you have not grown sick. (Isaiah 57:10)
- Jehovah's Witnesses as an organization have grown fat, with fine Kingdom Hall buildings, Assembly Halls and a massive worldwide publishing organization. Yet they have left the principles of divine justice, support of truth and looking out for the interests of the lowly, unfortunate and downtrodden ones.
- They have grown fat. They have become shiny. They have also overflowed with bad things. No legal case have they pleaded, even the legal case of the fatherless boy, that they may gain success, and the judgment of the poor ones they have not taken up. (Jeremiah 5:28)
- Christ today would likewise be deeply saddened by the lack of respect for truth, by a sad lack of appreciation for new understanding, by the lack of respect for the sacredness of young anointed ones lives, by the lying and slander he sees, and also by the love of prominence and outright corruption, he sees among God's people. Really, what has happened to the heart of the Daughter of Zion? It is astonishing, that people absolutely refuse to even listen, to the best news, that they are ever likely to hear.
- Over the breakdown of the daughter of my people I have become shattered. I have grown sad. Outright astonishment has seized hold of me. (Jeremiah 8:21)
- Baruch felt honored to be Jeremiah's secretary, and realized the power of the words, that Yehowah spoke through Jeremiah. He exercised great courage to go before the men of the land, and talk openly Yehowah words to them. Yet things kept getting worse for Jeremiah and Baruch, and there was no resting place for either of them. He was growing weary of talking to a people who did not listen. He wanted respect and honor before men for his work.
- You have said; Woe, now, to me, for Yehowah has added grief to my pain! I have grown weary because of my sighing, and no

resting-place have I found. (Jeremiah 45:3)

- Jeremiah showed the Israel was had grown weary from her enemies being close upon her.
- Close onto our neck we have been pursued. We have grown weary. No rest has been left for us. (Lamentations 5:5)
- Jeremiah lamented that his people's skin had grown hot from the pangs of hunger.
- Our very skin has grown hot just like a furnace, because of the pangs of hunger. (Lamentations 5:10)
- Jeremiah lamented that his people's eyes had grown dim, on account of a sick heart.
- On this account our heart has become ill. On account of these things our eyes have grown dim. (Lamentations 5:17)
- Daniel showed that the tree that had grown great represented Nebuchadnezzar himself.
- It is you, O king, because you have grown great and become strong, and your grandeur has grown great and reached to the heavens, and your rulership to the extremity of the earth. (Daniel 4:22)
- Yehowah now tells Samaria, referring to Israel, that their self appointed idol, the calf that they set up in Bethel and in Dan, has been rejected by Yehowah God, for his anger has grown hot against Israel. They are no longer capable of innocency before him, for these long-standing practices, which Yehowah God views as detestable. Likewise Christendom has incorporated idol worship into her rites of worship for centuries, and she also is today incapable of innocency before her God.
- Your calf has been cast off, O Samaria. My anger has grown hot against them. How long will they be incapable of innocency? (Hosea 8:5)
- Yehowah now shows Hosea, how hard a time he has, in coming to this judgment, to destroy Ephraim for his wickedness. He asks; How can I set you as Admah or like Zeboiim, two of the cities overthrown in complete destruction along with Sodom and Gomorrah.

Yehowah's heart has changed within him toward his people Israel over their unfaithfulness, and he feels a turmoil over this judgment, because his compassions for them also have grown hot, yet their judgment must come.

- How can I give you up, O Ephraim? How can I deliver you up, O Israel? How can I set you as Admah? How can I place you like Zeboiim? My heart has changed within me, at the same time my compassions have grown hot. (Hosea 11:8)
- The harvest of the earth has indeed come to fruition or grown ripe, the crop of badness among the nations of the earth today, has fully ripened. So he commands his angelic armies to descend, for the winepress has become full, and the press vats have become full, and are overflowing, for the badness of mankind has become abundant in all the earth, and he has come to put a stop to it, similar to what he did in the days of Noah.
- Thrust in a sickle, for harvest has grown ripe. Come, descend, for the winepress has become full. The press vats actually overflow, for their badness has become abundant. (Joel 3:13)
- So Yehowah counsels, that against the religious shepherds his anger has grown hot, and against all their goat-like leaders, he will hold an accounting. Yehowah has now turned his own attention to the ones shepherding his flock, the house of Judah, his spirit anointed Christians sons, and he has made them, like his horse of dignity, in bringing the war against error and falsehood to these ones.
- Against the shepherds my anger has grown hot, and against the goatlike leaders I shall hold an accounting, for Yehowah of armies has turned his attention to his drove, the house of Judah, and has made them like his horse of dignity in the battle. (Zechariah 10:3)
- Isaiah also shows why these people cannot understand, for their hearts are bad, and they remain unreceptive to understanding coming from Yehowah God through his prophets. They have shut their eyes, so that they might never see again, and also their ears, so that they might never hear again. Since their hearts are wicked, Yehowah will not allow them to understand and somehow come to repentance.
- For the heart of this people has grown unreceptive, and with their ears they have heard without response, and they have shut

their eyes, that they might never see with their eyes and hear with their ears and get the sense of it with their hearts and turn back, and I heal them. (Matthew 13:15)

- Now the mustard seed is the tiniest of the seeds of a vegetable garden, and yet when it become a full grown plant, it is almost a tree, and birds of the heavens come to take roost upon its branches.
- Likewise the true Christian congregation started out as a tiny organization among those of the world, and yet it grew into the largest worldwide religious organization, which Satan the Devil and his demons, the birds of heaven, have taken up roosting upon all its many branches, corrupting these different sects and polluting all them.
- Which is, in fact, the tiniest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the largest of the vegetables and becomes a tree, so that the birds of heaven come and find lodging among its branches. (Matthew 13:32)
- So by now the hour of the day had grown late and his disciples came up to him, making note of the lateness of the hour, and the isolated area that they were in, with such a large crowd present.
- By now the hour had grown late, and his disciples came up to him and began to say; The place is isolated, and the hour is already late. (Mark 6:35)
- So his disciples boarded a boat, and started across the Sea of Galilee, heading for Capernaum on the opposite shore of the lake. When it had grown dark, Jesus had not yet come down from the mountain to them.
- And, boarding a boat, they set out across the sea for Capernaum. Well, by now it had grown dark and Jesus had not yet come to them. (John 6:17)
- Paul then showed, that as Isaiah had prophesied, that the heart of his people Israel had grown unreceptive to Yehowah God's words and promises from of old. Instead of watching faithfully for their fulfillment, they had instead heard without response, and they had closed their eyes to his advancing purpose, so as not to even see it. The end result was, that they would not turn around in repentance to God, and get the sense of his counsel and keep living.

- For the heart of this people has grown unreceptive, and with their ears they have heard without response, and they have shut their eyes, that they should never see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their heart and turn back, and I should heal them. (Acts of Apostles 28:27)
- When Moses grew up he refused to be called the offspring of the daughter of Pharaoh.
- By faith Moses, when grown up, refused to be called the son of the daughter of Pharaoh. (Hebrews 11:24)
- Jehovah's Witnesses have shown a remarkable endurance both in the Kingdom Preaching work and in bearing up under persecution and tribulation. They have done a significant worldwide preaching work in the time of the end, and they continue in it zealously, they have not grown weary. They have borne my name fearlessly to the most distant parts of the earth, and to strange foreign peoples.
- You are also showing endurance, and you have borne up for my names sake and have not grown weary. (Revelation 2:3)
