## ~GROWS (150)

[English, produces, cultivates, raises, breeds, nurtures]

- Judah promised to Tamar, Shelah when he grows of age to marry.
- So Judah said to Tamar his daughter-in-Law; Dwell as a widow in the house of your father until Shelah my son grows up. For he said to himself; He too may die like his brothers. Accordingly Tamar went and continued to dwell at her own father's house. (Genesis 38:11)
- If a man's head loses its hair, or grows bald, it is just baldness, not a sickness.
- As for a man, in case his head grows bald, it is baldness. He is clean. (Leviticus 13:40)
- And if his head grows bald up in front, it is forehead baldness. He is clean. (Leviticus 13:41)
- If a brother grows poor, a man who is his repurchaser could buy back his brother from slavery.
- In case your brother grows poor and has to sell some of his possession, a repurchaser closely related to him must also come and buy back what his brother sold. (Leviticus 25:25)
- If a brother grew poor alongside of an Israelite, he was to sustain him like he was an alien resident or a settler. He must not set him to slavish forced labor.
- And in case your brother grows poor and so he is financially weak alongside you, you must also sustain him. As an alien resident and a settler, he must keep alive with you. (Leviticus 25:35)
- And in case your brother grows poor alongside you and he has to sell himself to you, you must not use him as a worker in slavish service. (Leviticus 25:39)
- Job showed that his supporters would fall away and be silenced, like a winter torrent goes away when it grows hot.

- In due season they become waterless, they have been silenced, when it grows hot they are dried up from their place. (Job 6:17)
- Job showed, that if a tree grows old and its stump turns to dust, still it has hope, for upon seeing water it will sprout again.
- If its root grows old in the earth and in the dust its stump dies. (Job 14:8)
- Job showed that from vexation the eye grows dimmer.
- And from vexation my eye grows dimmer and my members are all of them like the shadow. (Job 17:7)
- Job thought that Yehowah God was growing angry with him due to the things he was experiencing.
- His anger also grows hot against me, and he keeps reckoning me as an adversary of his. (Job 19:11)
- The Psalmist showed that to Yehowah God he would cry out when his heart grows feeble within him.
- From the extremity of the earth I shall cry, even to you, when my heart grows feeble. Onto a rock that is higher than I am may you lead me. (Psalms 61:2)
- A prayer of the afflicted one in case he grows feeble and pours out his concerns to Yehowah God.
- Every morning I shall silence all the wicked ones of the earth, to cut off from the city of Yehowah all the practicers of what is hurtful. A prayer of the afflicted in case he grows feeble and pours out his concern before Yehowah himself. (Psalms 101:8)
- If we train our children well from the Bible then even when he grows old he will keep up with his good habits.
- Train up a boy according to the way for him, even when he grows old he will not turn aside from it. (Proverbs 22:6)
- Where there is no slanderer contention grows still, like a fire without fuel.

- Where there is no wood the fire goes out, and where there is no slanderer contention grows still. (Proverbs 26:20)
- Habakkuk can see, that because of this, Law grows numb, unresponsive to the needs of the people, who hate the violence and quarreling going on among them. Also, justice never goes forth to those seeking it. Habakkuk sees, that the wicked ones are surrounding the righteous ones, because of justice going forth crooked. In his eyes, this is not right, and Habakkuk asks his God, why he has not acted against it.
- Therefore Law grows numb, and justice never goes forth.

  Because the wicked one is surrounding the righteous one, for that reason justice goes forth crooked. (Habakkuk 1:4)
- Jesus then gave an illustration of what this would be like. It would be like, when spring comes, and the trees grow first with buds and then put forth leaves. Anyone seeing this knows, that summer must be coming soon.
- Now learn from the fig tree as an illustration this point. Just as soon as its young branch grows tender and it puts forth leaves, you know that summer is near. (Matthew 24:32)
- Now Jesus shows, that after planting the word or seed in his field the man goes to bed that night and eventually his seed starts to grow tall, just how he does not understand, for God makes it grow.
- And he sleeps at night and rises up by day, and the seed sprouts and grows tall, just how he does not know. (Mark 4:27)
- Desus now gives them an illustration of just how they could recognize that correct time. He said, that just as a fig tree puts forth leaves in the springtime, and by this people know that summer is approaching.
- Now from the fig tree learn the illustration. Just as soon as its young branch grows tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. (Mark 13:28)
