~GUDGODAH (29) (Gud'go-dah)

- A wilderness encampment of the Israelites, probably the same as Hor-haggidgad.
- And the sons of Israel pulled away from Beeroth Bene-jaakan for Moserah. There Aaron died, and he got to be buried there, and Eleazar his son began to act as priest instead of him.

 (Deuteronomy 10:6)
- From there they pulled away for Gudgodah, and from Gudgodah for Jotbathah, a land of torrent valleys running with water. (Deuteronomy 10:7)
- Next they pulled away from Hor-haggidgad and went camping in Jotbathah. (Numbers 33:33)
- Some, believing the name Gudgodah to be preserved in Wadi Khadakhid, suggest that this place may have been located on Wadi Khadakhid, about 65 kilometers (40 miles) North-Northwest of the Gulf of `Aqaba. But this has been questioned, since the Hebrew consonants of Gudgodah do not actually correspond to those of Khadakhid. Concerning the order in which the Israelite camping sites are listed in Numbers and Deuteronomy.
