## ~HADORAM 2 (34)

(Ha-do'ram)

- Son of Hamath's King Tou. Hadoram was sent by his father to David with congratulations and gifts to mark Israel's victory over the king of Zobah.
- When Tou the king of Hamath heard that David had struck down all the military force of Hadadezer the king of Zobah. (1 Chronicles 18:9)
- He immediately sent Hadoram his son to King David to ask him about his welfare and congratulate him over the fact that he had fought against Hadadezer so that he struck him down, for Hadadezer had become trained in warfare against Tou, and there were with him all sorts of articles of gold and silver and copper. (1 Chronicles 18:10)
- These also King David sanctified to Yehowah together with the silver and the gold that he had carried off from all the nations, from Edom and from Moab and from the sons of Ammon and from the Philistines and from Amalek. (1 Chronicles 18:11)
- Called Joram at;
- So he sent Joram his son to King David to ask him about his welfare and congratulate him over the fact that he had fought against Hadadezer so that he struck him down, for Hadadezer had become trained in warfare against Toi, and in his hand there proved to be articles of silver and articles of gold and articles of copper.
