~HALLELUYAH (104) (Hal-le-lu'yah)

- A transliteration of the Hebrew expression *ha-lelu-yah'*, appearing first at;
- The sinners will be finished off from the earth, and as for the wicked, they will be no longer. Bless Yehowah, O my soul. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 104:35)
- In the New World Translation it is nearly always translated praise Yah, you people. The expression occurs 24 times in the Hebrew Scriptures and, with the exception of;
- Praise Yah, for Yehowah is good. Make melody to his name, for it is pleasant. (Psalms 135:3)
- Praise Yah, NW, introduces and/or concludes the Psalms in which it is found.
- Praise Yah, you people! Happy is the man in fear of Yehowah, in whose commandments he has taken very much delight. (Psalms 112:1)
- But we ourselves will bless Yah from now on and to time indefinite. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 115:18)
- Praise Yah, you people! Praise Yehowah, O my soul. (Psalms 146:1)
- Yehowah will be king to time indefinite, your God, O Zion, for generation after generation. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 146:10)
- Praise Yah, you people, for it is good to make melody to our God, for it is pleasant, praise is fitting. (Psalms 147:1)
- He has not done that way to any other nation, and as for his judicial decisions, they have not known them. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 147:20)
- Praise Yah, you people! Praise Yehowah from the heavens,

- praise him in the heights. (Psalms 148:1)
- And he will exalt the horn of his people, the praise of all his loyal ones, of the sons of Israel, the people near to him. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 148:14)
- Praise Yah, you people! Sing to Yehowah a new song, this praise in the congregation of loyal ones. (Psalms 149:1)
- To execute upon them the judicial decision written. Such splendor belongs to all his loyal ones. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 149:9)
- Praise Yah, you people! Praise God in his holy place. Praise him in the expanse of his strength. (Psalms 150:1)
- Every breathing thing, let it praise Yah. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 150:6)
- This expression stands alongside Amen at the close of Book Four of Psalms
- Blessed be Yehowah the God of Israel from time indefinite even to time indefinite, and all the people must say Amen. Praise Yah, you people! (Psalms 106:48)
- And a Greek form of it appears four times at,
- After these things I heard what was as a loud voice of a great crowd in heaven. They said; Praise Yah, you people! The salvation and the glory and the power belong to our God. (Revelation 19:1)
- Because his judgments are true and righteous. For he has executed judgment upon the great harlot who corrupted the earth with her fornication, and he has avenged the blood of his slaves at her hand. (Revelation 19:2)
- And right away for the second time they said; Praise Yah, you people! And the smoke from her goes on ascending forever and ever. (Revelation 19:3)
- And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God seated upon the throne, and said;

Amen! Praise Yah, you people! (Revelation 19:4)

- Also, a voice issued forth from the throne and said; Be praising our God, all you his slaves, who fear him, the small ones and the great. (Revelation 19:5)
- And I heard what was as a voice of a great crowd and as a sound of many waters and as a sound of heavy thunders. They said; Praise Yah, you people, because Yehowah our God, the Almighty, has begun to rule as king. (Revelation 19:6)
- Where the reference is to the joy experienced over the destruction of Babylon the Great and that associated with Yehowah's beginning to rule as King.
