~HAROSHETH (32) (Ha-ro'sheth)

- A site, called fully Harosheth of the nations, that served as military headquarters for Sisera, the army chief of the Canaanite king Jabin, who ruled in Hazor.
- So Yehowah sold them into the hand of Jabin the king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor, and the chief of his army was Sisera, and he was dwelling in Harosheth of the nations. (Judges 4:2)
- At once Sisera called together all his war chariots, the nine hundred war chariots with iron scythes, and all the people that were with him, out of Harosheth of the nations to the torrent valley of Kishon. (Judges 4:13)
- Judge Barak pressed his victory over these enemy forces to this same point.
- And Barak chased after the war chariots and the camp as far as Harosheth of the nations, so that all the camp of Sisera fell by the edge of the sword. Not as much as one remained. (Judges 4:16)
- The name Harosheth, meaning, Woodland, Woody Thicket, seems to be preserved at el-Harithiyeh, near the western exit of the Plain of Jezreel and about 16 kilometers (10 miles) North-Northwest of Megiddo. However, scholars usually hold that the actual ancient site was at nearby Tell `Amr, Tel Me`ammer.
