

**~HAROSHETH (32)**  
**(Ha-ro'sheth)**

- A site, called fully **Harosheth of the nations**, that served as military headquarters for Sisera, the army chief of the Canaanite king Jabin, who ruled in Hazor.
- So Yehowah sold them into the hand of Jabin the king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor, and the chief of his army was Sisera, and he was dwelling in **Harosheth of the nations**. (**Judges 4:2**)
- At once Sisera called together all his war chariots, the nine hundred war chariots with iron scythes, and all the people that were with him, out of **Harosheth of the nations** to the torrent valley of Kishon. (**Judges 4:13**)
- Judge Barak pressed his victory over these enemy forces to this same point.
- And Barak chased after the war chariots and the camp as far as **Harosheth** of the nations, so that all the camp of Sisera fell by the edge of the sword. Not as much as one remained. (**Judges 4:16**)
- The name **Harosheth**, meaning, **Woodland, Woody Thicket**, seems to be preserved at **el-Harithiyeh**, near the western exit of the Plain of Jezreel and about 16 kilometers (10 miles) North-Northwest of Megiddo. However, scholars usually hold that the actual ancient site was at nearby **Tell `Amr, Tel Me`ammer**.
