

~HASTEN (48)

[English, hurry, make haste, rush, speed up, speed, accelerate, move along, be quick]

- During Joshua's day the sun stood still for a whole day and did not **hasten** to set while they vanquished their enemies.
- Accordingly the sun kept motionless, and the moon did stand still, until the nation could take vengeance on its enemies. Is it not written in the book of Jashar? And the sun kept standing still in the middle of the heavens and did not **hasten** to set for about a whole day. (**Joshua 10:13**)
- A messenger told Saul to **hasten** for the Philistines had made a raid upon the land.
- But there was a messenger that came to Saul, saying; Do **hasten** and go, for the Philistines have made a raid on the land! (**1 Samuel 23:27**)
- The Psalmist said that he would **hasten** to a place of escape for him.
- I would **hasten** to a place of escape for me from the rushing wind, from the tempest. (**Psalms 55:8**)
- Yehowah foretold woe for those who wanted Yehowah's day of fury to **hasten** or come in sooner.
- Those who are saying; Let his work **hasten**. Do let it come quickly, in order, that we may see it. Let the counsel of the Holy One of Israel draw near and come, that we may know it! (**Isaiah 5:19**)
- Jeremiah showed that he kept up his work of shepherding Israel as gradual prophet and did not yearn for Yehowah's day of judgment to **hasten**.
- But as for me, I did not **hasten** from being a shepherd following you, and for the desperate day I did not show any craving. You yourself have known the expression of my lips, in front of your face it has occurred. (**Jeremiah 17:16**)

- He will remember his majestic ones. They will stumble in their walking. They will **hasten** to her wall, and the barricade will have to be firmly established. (**Nahum 2:5**)
