

~HASTE (118)

[English, speed, swiftness, rapidity, rush, hurriedness, quickness, acceleration, Opposite of, **slowness**]

- Yehowah God's Passover was to be eaten in **haste** and so the unleavened bread was part of the meal.
- And in this way you should eat it, with your hips girded, sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand, and you must eat it in **haste**. It is Yehowah's Passover. (**Exodus 12:11**)
- You must eat nothing leavened along with it for seven days. You should eat along with it unfermented cakes, the bread of affliction, because it was in **haste** that you came out of the land of Egypt, that you may remember the day of your coming out of the land of Egypt all the days of your life. (**Deuteronomy 16:3**)
- Yehowah God showed Moses that he would bring vengeance against his enemies and that this day was nearing, and so they should make **haste** to prepare for it.
- Vengeance is mine, and retribution. At the appointed time their foot will move unsteadily, for the day of their disaster is near, and the events in readiness for them do make **haste**. (**Deuteronomy 32:35**)
- Jonathan told his attendant to make haste and collect his arrows.
- And Jonathan went on calling from behind the attendant; In **haste!** Act quickly! Do not stand still! And the attendant of Jonathan went picking up the arrows and then came to his master. (**1 Samuel 20:38**)
- The Jewess Esther was pleasing to the eyes of the Persian king, and so he made **haste** to give her favor in his eyes, and complete her preparation for becoming his queen.
- Now the young woman was pleasing in his eyes, so that she gained loving-kindness before him and he made **haste** to give her, her massages and her appropriate food, and to give her seven selected young women from the king's house, and he proceeded to transfer her and her young women to the best

place of the house of the women. (**Esther 2:9**)

- The Psalmist pleaded with Yehowah God to make **haste** to come to his assistance.
- But you, O Yehowah, O do not keep far off. O you my strength, do make **haste** to my assistance. (**Psalms 22:19**)
- Do make **haste** to my assistance, O Yehowah my salvation. (**Psalms 38:22**)
- Be pleased, O Yehowah, to deliver me. O Yehowah, to my assistance do make **haste**. (**Psalms 40:13**)
- O God, to deliver me, O Yehowah, to my assistance do make **haste**. (**Psalms 70:1**)
- O Yehowah, I have called upon you. Do make **haste** to me. Do give ear to my voice when I call to you. (**Psalms 141:1**)
- Yehowah will call for a great nation, the United Nations, to come in to discipline his people. They are at the extremity of the earth, because the United Nations is as opposed to God's purpose as anyone can be, and they are a great nation, because they are the foretold eighth world power. They want to rule all of the earth and completely control it. The events on earth will take a very sudden and unforeseen turn by men, and then in **haste**, it will swiftly come in.
- And he has raised up a signal to a great nation far away, and he has whistled to it at the extremity of the earth, and, look! In **haste** it will swiftly come in. (**Isaiah 5:26**)
- So Herod's daughter in **haste** returned to the king and relayed the request of her mother, to give her the head of John the Baptist on a platter.
- Immediately she went in with **haste** to the king and made her request, saying; I want you to give me right away on a platter the head of John the Baptist. (**Mark 6:25**)
- So Mary immediately went in **haste** to the mountainous country where Elizabeth and Zechariah lived, to a city of Judah.
- So Mary rose in these days and went into the mountainous

country with **haste**, to a city of Judah. (**Luke 1:39**)

- So they went in **haste** into the city and found Mary and Joseph there, along with the young child, who was lying in the manger as promised.
- And they went with **haste** and found Mary as well as Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. (**Luke 2:16**)
- Therefore Paul was sending him first, and with greater **haste** than Timothy, because he knew that upon seeing him, that the Philippians would rejoice, that he was well again, and be more free from grief.
- Therefore with the greater **haste** I am sending him, that on seeing him you may rejoice again and I may be the more free from grief. (**Philippians 2:28**)
