- Haman was brought in hastily to the banquet.
- While they were yet speaking with him the kings court officials themselves arrived and proceeded hastily to bring Haman to the banquet that Esther had made. (Esther 6:14)
- The vineyard of the wicked one will hastily be destroyed.
- In the field its fodder they harvest, and the vineyard of the wicked one they hastily despoil. (Job 24:6)
- The Psalmist understands that there is no place to hide from Yehowah.
- And were I to say; Surely darkness itself will hastily seize me! Then night would be light about me. (Psalms 139:11)
- It is unwise to conduct a legal case hastily. It can lead to humiliation.
- Do not go forth to conduct a legal case hastily, that it may not be a question of what you will do in the culmination of it when your fellowman now humiliates you. (Proverbs 25:8)
- Elders are counseled not to hastily lay their hands upon another man to fill him with power and authority, but to test his out first.
