

~HEALTH (152)

[English, physical condition, fitness, well-being, healthiness, strength, vigor, shape]

- True wisdom is life to those finding it, and **health** to their flesh.
- For they are life to those finding them and **health** to all their flesh. (**Proverbs 4:22**)
- To Hezekiah, serving God was what kept him living, and so Yehowah heard his prayer and restored his life and **health**.
- O Yehowah, on that account they keep living, and as with everybody, thereby is the life of my spirit. And you will restore me to **health** and certainly preserve me alive. (**Isaiah 38:16**)
- Yet, after their disciplining by him, he would turn around to the remnant of exiles, and bringing about a recuperation and spiritual **health** to them. He would then give to them from his great storehouse of knowledge and understanding, an abundance of peace and truth.
- Here I am bringing up for her a recuperation and **health**, and I will heal them and reveal to them an abundance of peace and truth. (**Jeremiah 33:6**)
- After hearing them, Jesus responded, that people who are **healthy** do not need a physician, but only sick people need a doctor. He thus showed, that he was a healing one among them, both physically and spiritually, and that he went to people who needed his attention, something that the self-righteous scribes and Pharisees saw no value in doing.
- Hearing them, he said; Persons in **health** do not need a physician, but the ailing do. (**Matthew 9:12**)
- Jesus then said to her; Daughter, your faith has made you well, therefore go in peace, and enjoy your good **health**. Under Israelite Law a woman with a running discharge of blood was unclean all the time, that she had the discharge of blood, and as such, no man would come to her to have relations with her. Also the loss of blood weakened her causing other **health** problems. Therefore this really changed her life for the better.

- He said to her; Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace, and be in good **health** from your grievous sickness. (**Mark 5:34**)
- Then these slaves departed, and when they returned home they found the slave already well, and in good **health**.
- And those that had been sent, on getting back to the house, found the slave in good **health**. (**Luke 7:10**)
- Then the slave responded, that his younger brother had returned home in good **health**, and so the father had slaughtered a fattened young bull, and they were rejoicing, because they got him back in good health.
- He said to him, Your brother has come, and your father slaughtered the fattened young bull, because he got him back in good **health**. (**Luke 15:27**)
- So he began to inquire of them, at what hour the boy had gotten better in **health**, and they told the man that it was yesterday at the seventh hour, or around 1:00 P.M, for that was when the fever had left the boy.
- Therefore he began to inquire of them the hour in which he got better in **health**. Accordingly they said to him; Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. (**John 4:52**)
- So then Jesus upon seeing the man lying down, and realizing, that he had been sick for a very long time, asked him; Do you want to become sound in **health**?
- Seeing this man lying down, and being aware that he had already been sick a long time, Jesus said to him; Do you want to become sound in **health**? (**John 5:6**)
- At his word, the man who had been sick for thirty-eight years became sound in **health**, and he did pick up his cot and began to walk. Now the day that Jesus performed this healing was also a Sabbath.
- With that the man immediately became sound in **health**, and he picked up his cot and began to walk. Now on that day it was a Sabbath. (**John 5:9**)

- However the man told them, that the very one who had **healed** him had told him to pick up his cot and walk on home. No doubt this man felt that such authority superseded theirs.
- But he answered them; The very one that made me sound in **health** said to me; Pick up your cot and walk. (**John 5:11**)
- Yet later Jesus found the man walking in the temple, and witnessed further to him telling him, that now that he had become sound in **health**, he should sin no more, so that something worse does not happen to him. This seemed to infer, that the man had had a demon, and this caused him to be lame.
- After these things Jesus found him in the temple and said to him; See, you have become sound in **health**. Do not sin anymore, in order, that something worse does not happen to you. (**John 5:14**)
- So the man went away after finding out that it was Jesus who had **healed** him, and told the religious leaders that it was Jesus.
- The man went away and told the Jews it was Jesus that made him sound in **health**. (**John 5:15**)
- If a man receives circumcision on a Sabbath in order, that the Law of Moses may not be broken, are you violently angry at me because I made a man completely sound in **health** on a Sabbath? (**John 7:23**)
- They then told the Antioch congregation, that they must abstain from things sacrificed to idols, and from animals that were killed through strangulation, and from the use of blood, and from fornication. If they kept clear of these things, then they felt that they would prosper, and have good **health**.
- To keep abstaining from things sacrificed to idols and from blood and from things strangled and from fornication. If you carefully keep yourselves from these things, you will prosper. Good **health** to you! (**Acts of Apostles 15:29**)
- John extends his hope that Gaius is prospering and having good **health**.
- Beloved one, I pray that in all things you may be prospering and

having good **health**, just as your soul is prospering. (**3 John 1:2**)
