## ~HERODION (35) (He-ro'di-on)

- One to whom Paul sent personal greetings in his letter to the Christian congregation at Rome. Paul refers to Herodion as my relative.
- Greet Herodion my relative. Greet those from the household of Narcissus who are in the Lord. (Romans 16:11)
- Some suggest that this may simply mean that Herodion was a fellow Jew rather than an immediate member of Paul's family, in view of the apostles use of the designation relatives at;
- For I could wish that I myself were separated as the cursed one from the Christ in behalf of my brothers, my relatives according to the flesh. (Romans 9:3)
- However, since Paul does not refer to all the Jews to whom he sent greetings as my relatives.
- And he found a certain Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus who had recently come from Italy, and Priscilla his wife, because of the fact that Claudius had ordered all the Jews to depart from Rome. So he went to them (Acts of Apostles 18:2)
- Give my greetings to Prisca and Aquila my fellow workers in Christ Jesus. (Romans 16:3)
- Likely a closer relative is meant.
