- The fifth letter in the Hebrew alphabet. In speaking, he has a guttural sound somewhere between the softer 'a'leph' and the harsher chehth.
- It thus corresponds generally to the English h and is similar to the sound of h in the word behind. In the Hebrew, it appears at the beginning of each verse of;
- Instruct me, O Yehowah, in the way of your regulations, that I may observe it down to the last. (Psalms 119:33)
- Make me understand, that I may observe your Law and that I may keep it with the whole heart. (Psalms 119:34)
- Cause me to tread in the pathway of your commandments, for in it I have taken delight. (Psalms 119:35)
- Incline my heart to your reminders, and not to profits. (Psalms 119:36)
- Make my eyes pass on from seeing what is worthless. Preserve me alive in your own way. (Psalms 119:37)
- Carry out to your servant your saying that tends to the fear of you. (Psalms 119:38)
- Make my reproach pass away, of which I have been scared, for your judicial decisions are good. (Psalms 119:39)
- Look! I have longed for your orders. In your righteousness preserve me alive. (Psalms 119:40)
- The letters *he* and *chehth* are very similar in form.
