~HIDING (200)

[English, concealing, hiding from sight, putting out of view, secreting, veiling, burying, covering, screening]

- Once Adam and Eve sinned they went into hiding from the face of Yehowah God.
- Later they heard the voice of Yehowah God walking in the garden about the breezy part of the day, and the man and his wife went into hiding from the face of Yehowah God in between the trees of the garden. (Genesis 3:8)
- Under the Law Covenant a man hiding his idol worship was a cursed one.
- Cursed is the man who makes a carved image or a molten statue, a thing detestable to Yehowah, the manufacture of the hands of a wood-and-metal worker, and who has put it in a hiding place. And all the people must answer and say; Amen! (Deuteronomy 27:15)
- Any man striking a man causing his death while concealed in his hiding place against the man was cursed.
- Cursed is the one who fatally strikes his fellowman from a hiding place. And all the people must say; Amen! (Deuteronomy 27:24)
- Moses showed that Yehowah God was a hiding place for his people from their enemies.
- A hiding place is the God of ancient time, and underneath are the indefinitely lasting arms. And he will drive away from before you the enemy, and he will say; Annihilate them! (Deuteronomy 33:27)
- Five kings of Canaan went to hiding themselves in a cave from Joshua and the Israelites.
- Meantime these five kings fled and went hiding themselves in the cave at Makkedah. (Joshua 10:16)

- The people went to hiding themselves in the caves and hollows because they were hard pressed.
- And the men of Israel themselves saw that they were in sore straits, because the people were hard pressed, and the people went hiding themselves in the caves and the hollows and the crags and the vaults and the waterpits. (1 Samuel 13:6)
- Saul told his servants to ascertain about all the hiding places where David when hiding himself.
- And see and ascertain about all the hiding places where he hides himself, and you must return to me with the evidence, and I will go with you, and it must occur that, if he is in the land, I will also search for him carefully among all the thousands of Judah. (1 Samuel 23:23)
- Look! Now he is in hiding in one of the hollows or in one of the other places, and it will certainly occur that, just as soon as he falls upon them at the start, the one hearing of it will then be bound to hear and say; A defeat has taken place among the people that are following Absalom! (2 Samuel 17:9)
- Johoash was in hiding from Athaliah for six years.
- And he continued with her at the house of Yehowah in hiding for six years, while Athaliah was reigning over the land. (2 Kings 11:3)
- When Ornan saw Yehowah God's angel. Then his four sons went to hiding themselves.
- Meantime, Ornan turned back and saw the angel, and his four sons with him were hiding themselves. Now Ornan had been threshing wheat. (1 Chronicles 21:20)
- The went looking for Ahaziah where had gone into hiding in Samaria and captured him.
- Then he went looking for Ahaziah, and they finally captured him, as he was hiding in Samaria, and brought him to Jehu. Then they put him to death and buried him, for they said; He is the grandson of Jehoshaphat, who searched for Yehowah with all his heart. And there was no one of the house of Ahaziah to retain

power for the kingdom. (2 Chronicles 22:9)

- Job showed, that it would be a matter for the judges, if he had gone hiding his error in his shirt pocket.
- If like an earthling man I covered over my transgressions by hiding my error in my shirt pocket. (Job 31:33)
- Job showed that wild animals use a hiding place to attack their victims.
- And the wild beast comes into the ambush, and in its hiding places it dwells. (Job 37:8)
- When they crouch in the hiding places, or keep lying in the covert for an ambush? (Job 38:40)
- The Psalmist showed, that wicked men make statements about hiding traps for others.
- They hold themselves down to bad speech, they make statements about hiding traps. They have said; Who sees them? (Psalms 64:5)
- The Psalmist showed, that the wild animals seek out hiding places during the daylight.
- The sun begins to shine, they withdraw and they lie down in their own hiding places. (Psalms 104:22)
- The man hiding his eyes from helping unfortunate ones, will receive back many curses.
- He that is giving to the one of little means will have no want, but he that is hiding his eyes will get many curses. (Proverbs 28:27)
- After the destruction of all false religion by the nations, Yehowah will again raise up a loyal remnant, who will joyfully follow the lead provided by the Son of Man on the earth. He will establish them on earth and give them a place of rest, and will gather them together to a place of refuge, and there shelter them from nations who stand in opposition. He will then raise up true worship to a place of respect and honor worldwide under the Son of Man.

- And there will come to be a booth for a shade by day from the dry heat, and for a refuge and for a hiding place from the rainstorm and from the precipitation. (Isaiah 4:6)
- True justice is wise, loving and merciful. Justice is not faultfinding, nit-picking or cold and harsh. Men who love justice, weigh matters carefully, they try to see beyond an eye for an eye. They look to the needs of the whole person and the community, and then carefully weigh the correct course. Their purpose is always to bring back or recover the erring ones, with refreshing waters of truth and loving comfort, to effect repentance, and thus help others to avoid the wind of Yehowah's divine anger.
- And each one must prove to be like a hiding place from the wind and a place of concealment from the rainstorm, like streams of water in a waterless country, like the shadow of a heavy crag in an exhausted land. (Isaiah 32:2)
- Yes, why have the Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses taken to lying, by calling truth apostasy and by withholding fine scriptural counsel from God's people? They truly have forgotten the way of Yehowah. The answers to all of these questions were right in the book, Revealing The Sons Of God, but they refused to take any of it to heart.
- It was Yehowah himself who kept silent, and was hiding matters about the drama of Joseph, so that these wicked men might be caught in their error, and God's purpose might be accomplished. Because of not seeing his presence, they were in no fear of him, and acted wickedly toward their brother the Greater than Joseph, the Son of Man.
- Whom did you become frightened at and begin to fear, so that you took up lying? But I was not the one that you remembered. You took nothing to your heart. Was I not keeping silent and hiding matters? So you were in no fear even of me. (Isaiah 57:11)
- Daniel was then with others, and they saw something, but he alone saw the vision of a man. Meanwhile, they became afraid and ran away and went to hiding.
- And I saw, I Daniel by myself, the appearance, but as for the men that happened to be with me, they did not see the appearance. However, there was a great trembling that fell upon them, so that they went running away in hiding themselves. (Daniel 10:7)

- Then Yehowah God asks Israel, through Amos, if a lion will give out its hiding place, by roaring in a forest, when it has no prey. Or will a maned young lion reveal to other animals where it is hiding, if it has caught nothing at all. Through these examples Yehowah God shows that he has given his voice through his prophets, and the people of the land must pay attention to his presence among them, just as the lion roars upon gaining his prey, to frighten off other animals from his catch.
- Will a lion roar in the forest when it has no prey? Will a young maned lion give forth its voice from its hiding place if it has caught nothing at all? (Amos 3:4)
- Yehowah then shows how this lion among nations was faring, for he was tearing to pieces enough for his cubs, or whelps, and was strangling food for his lioness. Thus he kept his caves and covert hiding places filled with dead animals torn to pieces.
- The lion was tearing to pieces enough for his whelps, and was strangling for his lionesses. And he kept his holes filled with prey and his hiding places with animals torn to pieces. (Nahum 2:12)
- Then Yehowah's brightness came to be just like the light of the sun. He had two rays issuing out of his hand, and there was the hiding of his wonderful strength.
- As for his brightness, it got to be just like the light. He had two rays issuing out of his hand, and there the hiding of his strength was. (Habakkuk 3:4)
