- Remembering the Sabbath day to **hold** it sacred. (**Exodus 20:8**)

- And on the seventh day you should **hold** a holy convention. No sort of laborious work must you do. (**Numbers 28:25**)

- And on the eighth day you should **hold** a solemn assembly. No sort of laborious work must you do. (**Numbers 29:35**)
- Keeping the Sabbath day to **hold** it sacred, just as Yehowah your God commanded you. (**Deuteronomy 5:12**)
- At that I took **hold** of the two tablets and flung them down from both my hands and shattered them before your eyes. (**Deuteronomy 9:17**)
- At that I took **hold** of the two tablets and flung them down from both my hands and shattered them before your eyes. (**Deuteronomy 9:17**)
- His father and his mother must also take **hold** of him and bring him out to the older men of his city and to the gate of his place.

- When Adoni-bezek took to flight, then they went chasing after him and got **hold** of him and cut off the thumbs of his hands and the great toes of his feet. **(Judges 1:6)**
- So they took the provisions of the people in their hand, and their horns, and all the men of Israel he sent away each one to his home, and he kept **hold** of the three hundred men. As for the camp of Midian, it happened to be down below him in the low plain. **(Judges 7:8)**
- At that the three bands blew the horns and shattered the large jars and took fresh **hold** on the torches with their left hand and with their right hand on the horns to blow them, and they began calling out; Yehowah's sword and Gideon's! **(Judges 7:20)**
- Then they would say to him; Please say Shibboleth. And he would say; Sibboleth, as he was unable to say the word correctly. And they would lay **hold** of him and slay him at the fords of the Jordan. So there fell at that time forty-two thousand out of Ephraim. **(Judges 12:6)**
- And his father continued on his way down to the woman, and

Samson proceeded to **hold** a banquet there, for that was the way the young fellows used to do. (**Judges 14:10**)

- However, Samson kept lying till midnight and then rose at midnight and grabbed **hold** of the doors of the city gate and the two side posts and pulled them out along with the bar and put them upon his shoulders and went carrying them up to the top of the mountain that is in front of Hebron. (**Judges 16:3**)
- So the Philistines grabbed **hold** of him and bored his eyes out and brought him down to Gaza and bound him with two fetters of copper, and he came to be a grinder in the prison house. (**Judges 16:21**)
- Consequently his father-in-law, the young woman's father, took **hold** of him, so that he continued to dwell with him three days, and they would eat and drink, and he would stay overnight there. (**Judges 19:4**)
- And the men did not want to listen to him. Hence the man took **hold** of his concubine and brought her forth to them outside, and they began to have intercourse with her, and kept on abusing her all night long until the morning, after which they sent her off at the ascending of the dawn. (**Judges 19:25**)
- Then he entered his house and took the slaughtering knife and laid **hold** of his concubine and cut her up according to her bones into twelve pieces and sent her into every territory of Israel. (**Judges 19:29**)
- And Boaz proceeded to say to her at mealtime; Approach here, and you must eat some of the bread and dip your piece in the vinegar. So she sat down beside the harvesters, and he would **hold** out roasted grain to her and she would eat, so that she was satisfied and yet had something left over. (**Ruth 2:14**)
- And he went on to say; Bring the cloak that is on you, and **hold** it open. So she held it open, and he proceeded to measure out six measures of barley and to place it upon her, after which he went into the city. (**Ruth 3:15**)
- As Samuel was turning about to go, he immediately grabbed **hold** of the skirt of his sleeveless coat, but it ripped away. (**1 Samuel 15:27**)

- And I went out after it and struck it down and made the rescue from its mouth. When it began rising against me, I grabbed **hold** of its beard and struck it down and put it to death. (**1 Samuel 17:35**)
- Eventually Saul came to this side of the mountain, and David and his men were on that side of the mountain. So David became hurried to go away because of Saul. All the while Saul and his men were closing in on David and his men to grab **hold** of them. (**1 Samuel 23:26**)
- At this David took **hold** of his garments and ripped them apart, and so did all the men also that were with him. (**2 Samuel 1:11**)
- And they began grabbing **hold** of one another by the head, with the sword of each one in the side of the other, so that they fell down together. And that place came to be called Helkath-hazzurim, which is in Gibeon. (**2 Samuel 2:16**)
- May it whirl back upon the head of Joab and upon the entire house of his father, and let there not be cut off from Joab's house a man with a running discharge or a leper or a man taking **hold** of the twirling spindle or one falling by the sword or one in need of bread! (**2 Samuel 3:29**)
- When there was one reporting to me, saying; Here Saul is dead, and he himself in his own eyes became like a bringer of Good News, I, however, took **hold** of him and killed him in Ziklag when it was due for me to give him the messenger's fee. (**2 Samuel 4:10**)
- And they came gradually as far as the threshing floor of Nacon, and Uzzah now thrust his hand out to the ark of the true God and grabbed **hold** of it, for the cattle nearly caused an upset. (**2 Samuel 6:6**)
- When she came near to him for him to eat, he at once grabbed **hold** of her and said to her; Come, lie down with me, my sister. (**2 Samuel 13:11**)
- It also occurred that, when a man drew near to bow down to him, he thrust his hand out and grabbed **hold** of him and kissed him. (**2 Samuel 15:5**)

- To this Joab said; Let me not **hold** myself up this way before you! With that he took three shafts in his palm and proceeded to drive them through the heart of Absalom while he was yet alive in the heart of the big tree. (2 Samuel 18:14)
- And Joab proceeded to say to Amasa; Is it all right with you, my brother? Then Joab's right hand took **hold** of Amasa's beard so as to kiss him. (2 Samuel 20:9)
- And Adonijah himself was afraid because of Solomon. So he rose up and went away and grabbed **hold** of the horns of the altar. (1 Kings 1:50)
- In time the report was made to Solomon, saying; Here Adonijah himself has become afraid of King Solomon, and here he has taken **hold** on the horns of the altar, saying; Let King Solomon first of all swear to me that he will not put his servant to death by the sword. (1 Kings 1:51)
- And the report itself came clear to Joab, for Joab himself had inclined to follow Adonijah, although Absalom he had not inclined to follow, and Joab went fleeing to the tent of Yehowah and began to **hold** fast to the horns of the altar. (1 Kings 2:28)
- The lowest side chamber was five cubits in its width, and the middle one was six cubits in its width, and the third one was seven cubits in its width, for there were cutbacks that he gave to the house all around outside, that it might not have a **hold** in the walls of the house. (1 Kings 6:6)
- Moreover, he built the side chambers against the whole house five cubits in their height, and they had a **hold** on the house by timbers of cedar trees. (1 Kings 6:10)
- And they will have to say; For the reason that they left Yehowah their God who had brought their forefathers out from the land of Egypt, and they proceeded to take **hold** of other gods and bow down to them and serve them. That is why Yehowah brought upon them all this calamity. (1 Kings 9:9)
- Ahijah now took **hold** of the new garment that was on him and ripped it into twelve pieces. (1 Kings 11:30)

- And it came about that, as soon as the king heard the word of the man of the true God that he had called out against the altar in Bethel, Jeroboam at once thrust out his hand from off the altar, saying; You men, grab **hold** of him! Immediately his hand that he had thrust out against him became dried up, and he was not able to draw it back to himself. (**1 Kings 13:4**)
- At that the king of Israel called all the older men of the land and said; Take note, please, and see that it is calamity that this one is seeking, for he sent to me for my wives and my sons and my silver and my gold, and I did not **hold** them back from him. (**1 Kings 20:7**)
- All the while Elisha was seeing it, and he was crying out; My father, my father, the war chariot of Israel and his horsemen! And he did not see him anymore. Consequently he took **hold** of his own garments and ripped them into two pieces. (**2 Kings 2:12**)
- Then he said; Go, ask for vessels for yourself from outside, from all your neighbors, empty vessels. Do not **hold** yourself to a few. (**2 Kings 4:3**)
- So she saddled up the she-ass and said to her attendant; Drive and go ahead. Do not **hold** back for my sake from riding unless I shall have said so to you. (**2 Kings 4:24**)
- When she came to the man of the true God at the mountain, she at once took **hold** of him by his feet. At this Gehazi came near to push her away, but the man of the true God said; Let her alone, for her soul is bitter within her, and Yehowah himself has hidden it from me and not told me. (**2 Kings 4:27**)
- The king now commanded all the people, saying; **Hold** a Passover to Yehowah your God according to what is written in this book of the covenant. (**2 Kings 23:21**)
- And they came gradually as far as the threshing floor of Chidon, and Uzzah now thrust his hand out to grab **hold** of the Ark, for the bulls nearly caused an upset. (**1 Chronicles 13:9**)
- And Solomon proceeded to **hold** the festival at that time for seven days, and all Israel with him, a very great congregation from the entering in of Hamath down to the torrent valley of

Egypt. (2 Chronicles 7:8)

- **And they will have to say; It was for the reason that they left Yehowah the God of their forefathers who had brought them out of the land of Egypt, and they proceeded to take **hold** of other gods and bow down to them and serve them. That is why he brought upon them all this calamity. (2 Chronicles 7:22)**
- **And idle men, good-for-nothing fellows, kept collecting themselves together by him. Finally they proved superior to Rehoboam the son of Solomon, when Rehoboam himself happened to be young and fainthearted, and he did not **hold** his own against them. (2 Chronicles 13:7)**
- **And he proceeded to say; O Yehowah the God of our forefathers, are you not God in the heavens, and are you not dominating over all the kingdoms of the nations, and are there not in your hand power and mightiness, with no one to **hold** his ground against you? (2 Chronicles 20:6)**
- **Then the men that were designated by their names rose up and took **hold** of the captives, and all their naked ones they clothed from the spoil. So they clothed them and furnished them with sandals and fed them and gave them drink and greased them. Furthermore, in the case of anyone tottering, they gave them transportation on the asses and brought them to Jericho, the city of palm trees, beside their brothers. After that they returned to Samaria. (2 Chronicles 28:15)**
- **And Hezekiah proceeded to send to all Israel and Judah, and even letters he wrote to Ephraim and Manasseh, to come to the house of Yehowah in Jerusalem to **hold** the Passover to Yehowah the God of Israel. (2 Chronicles 30:1)**
- **However, the king and his princes and all the congregation in Jerusalem resolved to **hold** the Passover in the second month. (2 Chronicles 30:2)**
- **For they had not been able to **hold** it at that time, because not enough priests, on the one hand, had sanctified themselves and the people, on the other hand, had not gathered themselves to Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 30:3)**
- **So they decided to have the call pass through all Israel, from**

Beer-sheba to Dan, to come and **hold** the Passover to Yehowah the God of Israel at Jerusalem, for it was not as a multitude that they had done so according to what is written. (2 Chronicles 30:5)

- And they proceeded to gather themselves together at Jerusalem, a numerous people, to **hold** the festival of the unfermented cakes in the second month, a congregation very multitudinous. (2 Chronicles 30:13)
- Then all the congregation decided to **hold** it for seven more days, and so they held it for seven days with rejoicing. (2 Chronicles 30:23)
- And all the service of Yehowah was prepared on that day to **hold** the Passover and to offer up the burnt offerings upon the altar of Yehowah, according to the commandment of King Josiah. (2 Chronicles 35:16)
- And the sons of Israel that were to be found proceeded to **hold** the Passover at that time and also the festival of the unfermented cakes for seven days. (2 Chronicles 35:17)
- And the former exiles proceeded to **hold** the Passover on the fourteenth day of the first month. (Ezra 6:19)
- And they went on to **hold** the festival of unfermented cakes seven days with rejoicing, for Yehowah caused them to rejoice, and he had turned the heart of the king of Assyria around toward them to strengthen their hands in the work of the house of the true God, the God of Israel. (Ezra 6:22)
- And your good spirit you gave to make them prudent, and your manna you did not **hold** back from their mouth, and water you gave them for their thirst. (Nehemiah 9:20)
- And the king went on to **hold** a great banquet for all his princes and his servants, the banquet of Esther, and an amnesty for the jurisdictional districts he granted, and he kept giving presents according to the means of the king. (Esther 2:18)
- If I have found favor in the kings eyes and if to the king it does seem good to grant my petition and to act on my request, let the king and Haman come to the banquet that I shall **hold** for them

tomorrow, and tomorrow I shall do according to the kings word.

- Your ropes must hang loose, their mast they will not **hold** firmly erect, they have not spread a sail. At that time even spoil in abundance will have to be divided up. The lame ones themselves will actually take a big plunder. **(Isaiah 33:23)**
- You, whom I have taken **hold** of from the extremities of the earth, and you, whom I have called even from the remote parts of it. And so I said to you; You are my servant. I have chosen you, and I have not rejected you. **(Isaiah 41:9)**
- Do not be afraid, for I am with you. Do not gaze about, for I am

your God. I will fortify you. I will really help you. I will really keep fast **hold of you with my right hand of righteousness. (Isaiah 41:10)**

- **Look! My servant, on whom I keep fast **hold**! My chosen one, whom my soul has approved! I have put my spirit in him. Justice to the nations is what he will bring forth. (Isaiah 42:1)**
- **I myself, Yehowah, have called you in righteousness, and I proceeded to take **hold** of your hand. And I shall safeguard you and give you as a covenant of the people, as a light of the nations. (Isaiah 42:6)**
- **This is what Yehowah has said to his anointed one, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have taken **hold** of, to subdue before him nations, so that I may ungird even the hips of kings, to open before him the two-leaved doors, so that even the gates will not be shut. (Isaiah 45:1)**
- **There was none of all the sons that she brought to birth conducting her, and there was none of all the sons that she brought up taking **hold** of her hand. (Isaiah 51:18)**
- **Make the place of your tent more spacious. And let them stretch out the tent cloths of your grand tabernacle. Do not **hold** back. Lengthen out your tent cords, and make those tent pins of yours strong. (Isaiah 54:2)**
- **Happy is the mortal man that does this, and the son of mankind that lays **hold** of it, keeping the Sabbath in order not to profane it, and keeping his hand in order not to do any kind of badness. (Isaiah 56:2)**
- **For this is what Yehowah has said to the eunuchs that keep my Sabbaths and that have chosen what I have delighted in and that are laying **hold** of my covenant. (Isaiah 56:4)**
- **And the foreigners that have joined themselves to Yehowah to minister to him and to love the name of Yehowah, in order to become servants to him, all those keeping the Sabbath in order not to profane it and laying **hold** of my covenant. (Isaiah 56:6)**
- **Call out full-throated. Do not **hold** back. Raise your voice just like a horn, and tell my people their revolt, and the house of**

Jacob their sins. (Isaiah 58:1)

- And as for your people, all of them will be righteous. To time indefinite they will **hold** possession of the land, the sprout of my planting, the work of my hands, for me to be beautified. (Isaiah 60:21)
- And there is no one calling upon your name, no one rousing himself to lay **hold** on you, for you have concealed your face from us, and you cause us to melt by the power of our error. (Isaiah 64:7)
- **Hold** your foot back from becoming barefoot, and your throat from thirst. But you proceeded to say; It is hopeless! No, but I have fallen in love with strangers, and after them I am going to walk. (Jeremiah 2:25)
- Should I not **hold** an accounting because of these very things, is the utterance of Yehowah, or on a nation that is like this should not my soul avenge itself? (Jeremiah 5:29)
- Did they feel shame because it was something detestable that they had done? For one thing, they positively do not feel any shame, for another thing, they have not come to know even how to feel humiliated. Therefore they will fall among those who are falling, in the time that I must **hold** an accounting with them they will stumble, Yehowah has said. (Jeremiah 6:15)
- The bow and the javelin they will grab **hold** of. It is a cruel one, and they will have no pity. Their very voice will resound just like the sea, and upon horses they will ride. It is drawn up in battle order like a man of war against you, O daughter of Zion. (Jeremiah 6:23)
- We have heard the report about it. Our hands have dropped. Distress itself has seized **hold** of us, labor pains like those of a woman giving birth. (Jeremiah 6:24)
- Why is it that this people, Jerusalem, is unfaithful with an enduring unfaithfulness? They have taken **hold** of trickiness, they have refused to turn back. (Jeremiah 8:5)
- Over the breakdown of the daughter of my people I have become shattered. I have grown sad. Outright astonishment has seized

hold of me. (Jeremiah 8:21)

- Because of these things should I not **hold** an accounting with them? Is the utterance of Yehowah. Or upon a nation that is like this should not my soul avenge itself? (Jeremiah 9:9)
- Look! Days are coming, is the utterance of Yehowah, and I will **hold** an accounting with everyone circumcised but still in uncircumcision. (Jeremiah 9:25)
- But Yehowah is in truth God. He is the living God and the King to time indefinite. Because of his indignation the earth will rock, and no nations will **hold** up under his denunciation. (Jeremiah 10:10)
- What will you say when one turns his attention upon you, when you yourself have taught them as confidential friends right alongside you at the start? Will not birth pangs themselves seize **hold** of you, like those of a wife giving birth? (Jeremiah 13:21)
- I will also **hold** an accounting against you according to the fruitage of your dealings, is the utterance of Yehowah. And I will set a fire ablaze in her forest, and it will certainly devour all the things round about her. (Jeremiah 21:14)
- So it came about that when Jeremiah had completed speaking all that Yehowah had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid **hold** of him, saying; You will positively die. (Jeremiah 26:8)
- This is what Yehowah has said; **Hold** back your voice from weeping, and your eyes from tears, for there exists a reward for your activity, is the utterance of Yehowah, and they will certainly return from the land of the enemy. (Jeremiah 31:16)
- Not one like the covenant that I concluded with their forefathers in the day of my taking **hold** of their hand to bring them forth out of the land of Egypt, which covenant of mine they themselves broke, although I myself had husbandly ownership of them, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 31:32)
- So it came about when he was in the Gate of Benjamin that the officer **holding** the oversight, whose name was Irijah the son of Shelemiah the son of Hananiah, was there. At once he took hold

of Jeremiah the prophet, saying; It is to the Chaldeans that you are falling away! (**Jeremiah 37:13**)

- But Jeremiah said; It is false! I am not falling away to the Chaldeans. But he did not listen to him. So Irijah kept **hold** of Jeremiah and brought him in to the princes. (**Jeremiah 37:14**)
- At that Jeremiah the prophet said to them; I have heard. Here I am praying to Yehowah your God according to your words, and it will certainly occur that every word that Yehowah gives in answer to you I shall tell you. I shall not **hold** back from you a word. (**Jeremiah 42:4**)
- And I will **hold** an accounting against those dwelling in the land of Egypt, just as I held an accounting against Jerusalem, with the sword, with the famine and with the pestilence. (**Jeremiah 44:13**)
- Damascus has lost courage. She has turned to flee, and sheer panic has seized her. Distress and birth pangs themselves have taken **hold** of her, as with a woman that is giving birth. (**Jeremiah 49:24**)
- I have laid a snare for you and you have also been caught, O Babylon, and you yourself did not know it. You were found and also taken **hold** of, for it was against Yehowah that you excited yourself. (**Jeremiah 50:24**)
- This is what Yehowah of armies has said; The sons of Israel and the sons of Judah are being oppressed together, and all those taking them captive have laid **hold** on them. They have refused to let them go. (**Jeremiah 50:33**)
- The king of Babylon has heard the report about them, and his hands have dropped down. There is distress! Severe pains have seized **hold** of him, just like a woman giving birth. (**Jeremiah 50:43**)
- When they took **hold** of you by the hand, you got to be crushed, and you caused a split in their entire shoulder. And when they supported themselves upon you, you got to be broken, and you caused all their hips to wobble. (**Ezekiel 29:7**)
- Son of man, the arm of Pharaoh the king of Egypt I shall certainly

break, and, look! It will not be bound up at all in order to give it healing by putting a bandage on for binding it up, for it to become strong to take **hold** of the sword. ([Ezekiel 30:21](#))

- This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; On the day of its going down to Sheol I shall certainly cause a mourning. On its account I will cover the watery deep, that I may **hold** back its streams and that the many waters may be restrained, and on its account I shall darken Lebanon, and on its account the trees of the field will all swoon away. ([Ezekiel 31:15](#))
- And there must stand up in his position one who is to be despised, and they will certainly not set upon him the dignity of the kingdom, and he will actually come in during a freedom from care and take **hold** of the kingdom by means of smoothness. ([Daniel 11:21](#))
- And Yehowah went on to say to him; Call his name Jezreel, for yet a little while and I must **hold** an accounting for the acts of bloodshed of Jezreel against the house of Jehu, and I must cause the royal rule of the house of Israel to cease. ([Hosea 1:4](#))
- And I will **hold** an accounting against her for the days of the Baal images to which she kept making sacrificial smoke, when she kept decking herself with her ring and her ornament and kept going after her passionate lovers, and I was the one that she forgot, is the utterance of Yehowah. ([Hosea 2:13](#))
- And it will have to become for the people the same as for the priest, and I shall certainly **hold** an accounting against them for their ways, and their dealings I shall bring back upon them. ([Hosea 4:9](#))
- I shall not **hold** an accounting against your daughters because they commit fornication, and against your daughters-in-law because they commit adultery. For, as to the men, it is with the harlots that they get off to themselves, and with the female temple prostitutes that they sacrifice, and a people that does not understand will be trodden down. ([Hosea 4:14](#))
- As my gift sacrifices they kept sacrificing flesh, and they kept eating what Yehowah himself took no pleasure in. Now he will remember their error and **hold** an accounting for their sins. To Egypt they themselves proceeded to return. ([Hosea 8:13](#))

- And Yehowah has a legal case with Judah, even to **hold** an accounting against Jacob according to his ways, according to his dealings he will repay him. (**Hosea 12:2**)
- And Yehowah himself will certainly give forth his voice before his military force, for his camp is very numerous. For he who is carrying out his word is mighty, for the day of Yehowah is great and very fear-inspiring, and who can **hold** up under it? (**Joel 2:11**)
- You people only have I known out of all the families of the ground. That is why I shall **hold** an accounting against you for all your errors. (**Amos 3:2**)
- For, in the day of my **holding** an accounting for the revolts of Israel against him, I will also hold an accounting against the altars of Bethel, and the horns of the altar will certainly be cut off and must fall to the earth. (**Amos 3:14**)
- And I proceeded to say; O Sovereign Lord Yehowah, **hold** off, please. Who will rise up of Jacob? For he is small! (**Amos 7:5**)
- Now why is it that you keep shouting loudly? Is there no king in you, or has your own counselor perished, so that pangs like those of a woman giving birth have grabbed **hold** of you? (**Micah 4:9**)
- Who is a God like you, one pardoning error and passing over transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? He will certainly not **hold** onto his anger forever, for he is delighting in loving-kindness. (**Micah 7:18**)
- Yehowah is slow to anger and great in power, and by no means will Yehowah **hold** back from punishing. In destructive wind and in storm is his way, and the cloud mass is the powder of his feet. (**Nahum 1:3**)
- Water for a siege draw out for yourself. Strengthen your fortified places. Get into the mire, and trample down in the clay, grab **hold** of the brick mold. (**Nahum 3:14**)
- This is what Yehowah of armies has said; It will be in those days that ten men out of all the languages of the nations will take **hold**, yes, they will actually take hold of the skirt of a man who is

- a Jew, saying; We will go with you people, for we have heard that God is with you people. (**Zechariah 8:23**)
- Against the shepherds my anger has grown hot, and against the goatlike leaders I shall **hold** an accounting, for Yehowah of armies has turned his attention to his drove, the house of Judah, and has made them like his horse of dignity in the battle. (**Zechariah 10:3**)
 - And it must occur in that day that confusion from Yehowah will become widespread among them, and they will actually grab **hold**, each one of the hand of his companion, and his hand will actually come up against the hand of his companion. (**Zechariah 14:13**)
 - As soon as the crowd had been sent outside, he went in and took **hold** of her hand, and the little girl got up. (**Matthew 9:25**)
 - He said to them; Who will be the man among you that has one sheep and, if this falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will not get **hold** of it and lift it out? (**Matthew 12:11**)
 - Immediately stretching out his hand Jesus caught **hold** of him and said to him; You with little faith, why did you give way to doubt? (**Matthew 14:31**)
 - If, though, we say; From men, we have the crowd to fear, for they all **hold** John as a prophet. (**Matthew 21:26**)
 - But the rest, laying **hold** of his slaves, treated them insolently and killed them. (**Matthew 22:6**)
 - But when his relatives heard about it, they went out to lay **hold** of him, for they were saying; He has gone out of his mind. (**Mark 3:21**)
 - And, when back from market, they do not eat unless they cleanse themselves by sprinkling, and there are many other traditions that they have received to **hold** fast, baptisms of cups and pitchers and copper vessels. (**Mark 7:4**)
 - Letting go the commandment of God, you **hold** fast the tradition of men. (**Mark 7:8**)

- But they kept silent. With that he took **hold** of the man, healed him and sent him away. ([Luke 14:4](#))
- So he said to him; Well done, good slave! Because in a very small matter you have proved yourself faithful, **hold** authority over ten cities. ([Luke 19:17](#))
- Now as they led him away, they laid **hold** of Simon, a certain native of Cyrene, coming from the country, and they placed the torture stake upon him to bear it behind Jesus. ([Luke 23:26](#))
- As it was, there were six stone water jars sitting there as required by the purification rules of the Jews, each able to **hold** two or three liquid measures. ([John 2:6](#))
- Hence they began seeking to get **hold** of him, but no one laid a hand upon him, because his hour had not yet come. ([John 7:30](#))
- The Pharisees heard the crowd murmuring these things about him, and the chief priests and the Pharisees dispatched officers to get **hold** of him. ([John 7:32](#))
- Some of them, though, were wanting to get **hold** of him, but no one did lay his hands upon him. ([John 7:44](#))
- These sayings he spoke in the treasury as he was teaching in the temple. But no one laid **hold** of him, because his hour had not yet come. ([John 8:20](#))
- I shall not speak much with you anymore, for the ruler of the world is coming. And he has no **hold** on me. ([John 14:30](#))
- With that he took **hold** of him by the right hand and raised him up. Instantly the soles of his feet and his anklebones were made firm. ([Acts of Apostles 3:7](#))
- Whom heaven, indeed, must **hold** within itself until the times of restoration of all things of which God spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets of old time. ([Acts of Apostles 3:21](#))
- But Peter said; Ananias, why has Satan emboldened you to play false to the Holy Spirit and to **hold** back secretly some of the price of the field? ([Acts of Apostles 5:3](#))

- And yet they could not **hold** their own against the wisdom and the spirit with which he was speaking. (**Acts of Apostles 6:10**)
- And laying **hold** of him, he put him in prison, turning him over to four shifts of four soldiers each to guard him, as he intended to produce him for the people after the Passover. (**Acts of Apostles 12:4**)
- Well, when her masters saw that their hope of gain had left, they laid **hold** of Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace to the rulers. (**Acts of Apostles 16:19**)
- So they laid **hold** of him and led him to the Areopagus, saying; Can we get to know what this new teaching is which is spoken by you? (**Acts of Apostles 17:19**)
- So they all laid **hold** of Sosthenes the presiding officer of the synagogue and went to beating him in front of the judgment seat. But Gallio would not concern himself at all with these things. (**Acts of Apostles 18:17**)
- While I did not **hold** back from telling you any of the things that were profitable nor from teaching you publicly and from house to house. (**Acts of Apostles 20:20**)
- And the whole city was set in an uproar, and a running together of the people occurred, and they laid **hold** of Paul and dragged him outside the temple. And immediately the doors were closed. (**Acts of Apostles 21:30**)
- Then the military commander came near and took **hold** of him and gave command for him to be bound with two chains, and he proceeded to inquire who he might be and what he had done. (**Acts of Apostles 21:33**)
- Not that I have already received it or am already made perfect, but I am pursuing to see if I may also lay **hold** on that for which I have also been laid hold on by Christ Jesus. (**Philippians 3:12**)
- Brothers, I do not yet consider myself as having laid **hold** on it, but there is one thing about it. Forgetting the things behind and stretching forward to the things ahead. (**Philippians 3:13**)
- Make sure of all things. **Hold** fast to what is fine. (**1**

Thessalonians 5:21)

- So, then, brothers, stand firm and maintain your **hold** on the traditions that you were taught, whether it was through a verbal message or through a letter of ours. (**2 Thessalonians 2:15**)
- Fight the fine fight of the faith, get a firm **hold** on the everlasting life for which you were called and you offered the fine public declaration in front of many witnesses. (**1 Timothy 6:12**)
- Safely treasuring up for themselves a fine foundation for the future, in order, that they may get a firm **hold** on the real life. (**1 Timothy 6:19**)
- I would like to **hold** him back for myself that in place of you he might keep on ministering to me in the prison bonds I bear for the sake of the Good News. (**Philemon 1:13**)
- But Christ was faithful as a Son over the house of that One. We are the house of that One, if we make fast our **hold** on our freeness of speech and our boasting over the hope firm to the end. (**Hebrews 3:6**)
- For we actually become partakers of the Christ only if we make fast our **hold** on the confidence we had at the beginning firm to the end. (**Hebrews 3:14**)
- Seeing, therefore, that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us **hold** onto our confessing of him. (**Hebrews 4:14**)
- In order, that, through two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled to the refuge may have strong encouragement to lay **hold** on the hope set before us. (**Hebrews 6:18**)
- Not according to the covenant that I made with their forefathers in the day of my taking **hold** of their hand to bring them forth out of the land of Egypt, because they did not continue in my covenant, so that I stopped caring for them, says Yehowah. (**Hebrews 8:9**)
- Let us **hold** fast the public declaration of our hope without wavering, for he is faithful that promised. (**Hebrews 10:23**)

- **Hold** a good conscience, so that in the particular in which you are spoken against they may get ashamed who are speaking slightly of your good conduct in connection with Christ. (1 Peter 3:16)
- Certainly if God did not **hold** back from punishing the angels that sinned, but, by throwing them into Tartarus, delivered them to pits of dense darkness to be reserved for judgment. (2 Peter 2:4)
- And he did not **hold** back from punishing an ancient world, but kept Noah, a preacher of righteousness, safe with seven others when he brought a deluge upon a world of ungodly people. (2 Peter 2:5)
- We know that every person that has been born from God does not practice sin, but the One born from God watches him, and the wicked one does not fasten his **hold** on him. (1 John 5:18)
- For I rejoiced very much when brothers came and bore witness to the truth you **hold**, just as you go on walking in the truth. (3 John 1:3)
- Beloved ones, though I was making every effort to write you about the salvation we **hold** in common, I found it necessary to write you to exhort you to put up a hard fight for the faith that was once for all time delivered to the holy ones. (Jude 1:3)
- Nevertheless, I **hold** this against you, that you have left the love you had at first. (Revelation 2:4)
- Nevertheless, I do **hold** this against you, that you tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, and she teaches and misleads my slaves to commit fornication and to eat things sacrificed to idols. (Revelation 2:20)
