~HOR-HAGGIDGAD (36) (Hor-hag-gid'gad)

- An Israelite wilderness camping site. As discussed under the heading, a comparison of;
- Then they pulled away from Moseroth and went camping in Bene-jaakan. (Numbers 33:31)
- After that they pulled away from Bene-jaakan and went camping in Hor-haggidgad. (Numbers 33:32)
- Next they pulled away from Hor-haggidgad and went camping in Jotbathah. (Numbers 33:33)
- And the sons of Israel pulled away from Beeroth Bene-jaakan for Moserah. There Aaron died, and he got to be buried there, and Eleazar his son began to act as priest instead of him.

 (Deuteronomy 10:6)
- From there they pulled away for Gudgodah, and from Gudgodah for Jotbathah, a land of torrent valleys running with water. (Deuteronomy 10:7)
- Seems to indicate that the Israelites passed through this same region twice, Hor-haggidgad being called Gudgodah on the later trip.
 The exact location cannot be determined with certainty.
- Most scholars, however, tentatively identify Hor-haggidgad,
 Gudgodah, with a site on the Wadi Khadakhid, about 65 kilometers (40 miles) North-Northwest of the Gulf of `Aqaba.
