(Hor-o-na'im) [possibly, Two Holes, that is, caves]

- Its exact location is uncertain. However, the possible meaning of its name has led some to identify Horonaim tentatively with el-`Iraq,

meaning Cave, situated about 490 meters (1,600 feet) below the level of the Moabite plateau and about 18 kilometers (11 miles) East of the southern end of the Dead Sea.

Horonaim may be the same as the Hauronen mentioned in the Moabite Stone as having been taken in battle by Mesha the king of Moab
