~HORROR (51)

[English, dismay, revulsion, shock, disgust, repulsion, dreadfulness, awfulness, terror, Opposite of, delight]

- Yehowah foretold those Ezekiel that the inhabitants of Jerusalem would experience horror over their dwindling food and especially water supplies.
- And he continued saying to me; Son of man, here I am breaking the rods around which ring-shaped loaves are suspended, in Jerusalem, and they will have to eat bread by weight and in anxious care, and it will be by measure and in horror that they will drink water itself. (Ezekiel 4:16)
- And you must say to the people of the land; This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said to the inhabitants of Jerusalem upon the soil of Israel; With anxious care their bread they will eat, and with horror their water they will drink, in order, that its land may be laid desolate of its fullness because of the violence of all those dwelling in it. (Ezekiel 12:19)
- Yehowah also foretold through Ezekiel that he would make Jerusalem and her peoples a warning example and a horror before the nations through his acts of judgment against her.
- And you must become a reproach and an object of reviling words, a warning example and a horror to the nations that are all around you, when I do in you acts of judgment in anger and in rage and in raging reproofs. I myself, Yehowah, have spoken. (Ezekiel 5:15)
- Yehowah foretold through Ezekiel that Tyre would be destroyed and that all the islands and their kings would shudder in horror.
- All the inhabitants of the islands, in amazement they will certainly stare at you, and their kings themselves will have to shudder in horror. Faces must become perturbed. (Ezekiel 27:35)
- A similar prophecy was foretold for the Pharaoh who ultimately represents Satan the Devil, at his downfall.

And at you I shall certainly cause many peoples to be awestruck, and their kings themselves will shudder in horror at you when I brandish my sword in their faces, and they will have to tremble every moment, each one for his own soul, on the day of your downfall. (Ezekiel 32:10)
