

~HUMILIATE (75)

[English, disgrace, put down, show up, humble, debase]

- Sarah began to **humiliate** her maidservant Hagar so that she ran away from her.
- So Abram said to Sarai; Look! Your maidservant is at your disposal. Do to her what is good in your eyes. Then Sarai began to **humiliate** her so that she ran away from her. (**Genesis 16:6**)
- Tamar told her brother Amnon that for him to have sexual relations with her would only **humiliate** her before others, for such things were not done that way in Israel between a brother and sister.
- However, she said to him; No, my brother! Do not **humiliate** me. For it is not usual to do that way in Israel. Do not do this disgraceful folly. (**2 Samuel 13:12**)
- Nebuchadnezzar learned the hard way that Yehowah God is able to humiliate even mighty kings.

Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, am praising and exalting and glorifying the King of the heavens, because all his works are truth and his ways are justice, and because those who are walking in pride he is able to **humiliate**. (**Daniel 4:37**)

- The **ten horns**, that have arisen out of that Kingdom or rulership, have been the Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses, who have since consolidated their power over God's people, such that they run the organization of Jehovah's Witnesses.
- Still another rose up after them, not one of the anointed sons of God, Adams who is the sixth or current President of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society. He is different from the first ones, in that he is not one of the anointed. Five have fallen, one is, and one yet remains to come forth.
- And as for the ten horns, out of that kingdom there are ten kings that will rise up, and still another one will rise up after them, and he himself will be different from the first ones, and three kings he will **humiliate**. (**Daniel 7:24**)

- Paul does not want to have to mourn when he comes among them, for this will of necessity happen, if he finds cases of serious wrongdoing, or a bad spirit among them, that is not like Christ's spirit.
- He would have to mourn in **humiliation** then, if he should find among them any who practice fornication, loose conduct, which is licentiousness, wantonness, shameless conduct, thus showing a disrespect for Yehowah's divine Laws and principles.
- For any practice of these things would merit strong action against the wrongdoers, and Paul would rather come in love and joy of Holy Spirit, and be able to commend them for their fine works toward one another and to all.
- Perhaps, when I come again, my God might **humiliate** me among you, and I might mourn over many of those who formerly sinned but have not repented over their uncleanness and fornication and loose conduct that they have practiced. (**2 Corinthians 12:21**)
