## ~HUSHAH (31) (Hu'shah)

- Either a son of, or a city fathered or founded, by Ezer of the tribe of Judah.
- The sons of Judah were Perez, Hezron and Carmi and Hur and Shobal. (1 Chronicles 4:1)
- And Penuel the father of Gedor and Ezer the father of Hushah.

  These were the sons of Hur the firstborn of Ephrathah the father of Bethlehem. (1 Chronicles 4:4)
- If Hushah designates a city, then it was likely the home of one of David's mighty men, Sibbecai, who was probably also called Mebunnai.
- The eighth for the eighth month was Sibbecai the Hushathite of the Zerahites, and in his division there were twenty-four thousand. (1 Chronicles 27:11)
- Abi-ezer the Anathothite, Mebunnai the Hushathite. (2 Samuel 23:27)
- Sibbecai the Hushathite, Ilai the Ahohite. (1 Chronicles 11:29)
- Some regard Hushah as the name of a city and identify it with Husan, about 6 kilometers (3.5 miles) West of Bethlehem.
