[English, picturing, envisaging, envisioning, visualizing, seeing, seeing in mind's eye]

- Jesus disciples were <u>imagining</u> that the Kingdom of God was to come immediately.
- While they were listening to these things he spoke in addition an illustration, because he was near Jerusalem and they were imagining that the kingdom of God was going to display itself instantly. (Luke 19:11)
- When Jesus walked across the Sea of Galilee his disciples imagined that he was an apparition or a spirit.
- But because they were terrified, and had become frightened, they were imagining they beheld a spirit. (Luke 24:37)
- At the Memorial celebration some were imagining that Jesus was instructing Judas to leave and buy some provisions for them.
- Some, in fact, were imagining, since Judas was holding the money box, that Jesus was telling him; Buy what things we need for the festival, or that he should give something to the poor. (John 13:29)
- Mary upon encountering a man at Jesus tomb imagined that it was the gardener for Jesus had a different look.
- Jesus said to her; Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for? She, imagining it was the gardener, said to him; Sir, if you have carried him off, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away. (John 20:15)
- The Jews from Antioch and Icomium dragged Paul outside the city and then imagined that he was dead after they had stoned him.
- But Jews arrived from Antioch and Iconium and persuaded the crowds, and they stoned Paul and dragged him outside the city, imagining he was dead. (Acts of Apostles 14:19)

- The jailer imagining that Paul and Silas had escaped from the jail was about to end his own life by the sword.
- The jailer, being awakened out of sleep and seeing the prison doors were open, drew his sword and was about to do away with himself, imagining that the prisoners had escaped. (Acts of Apostles 16:27)
- The Jewish religious leaders imagined that Paul had brought Gentiles into the temple.
- For they had previously seen Trophimus the Ephesian in the city with him, but they were imagining Paul had brought him into the temple. (Acts of Apostles 21:29)
