[English, inflict, compel, oblige, force, impress, enforce, entail, require, necessitate]

- The wicked Pharaoh imposed a quota of bricks daily upon the Israelite men and women.
- Moreover, the required amount of bricks that they were making formerly, you will further impose upon them. You must not make any reduction for them, because they are relaxing. That is why they are crying out, saying; We want to go, we want to sacrifice to our God! (Exodus 5:8)
- The Israelites were told not to impose baldness upon their own person for a dead relative.
- Sons you are of Yehowah your God. You must not make cuttings upon yourselves or impose baldness on your foreheads for a dead person. (Deuteronomy 14:1)
- Hezekiah implored the King of Assyria to impose a monetary gift upon him for his sinning against him.
- So Hezekiah the king of Judah sent to the king of Assyria at Lachish, saying; I have sinned. Turn back from against me. Whatever you may impose upon me I shall carry. Accordingly the king of Assyria laid upon Hezekiah the king of Judah three hundred silver talents and thirty gold talents. (2 Kings 18:14)
- The Israelites had imposed upon them the obligation of the Passover each year.
- To impose upon them the obligation to be regularly holding the fourteenth day of the month Adar and the fifteenth day of it in each and every year. (Esther 9:21)
- Paul and his traveling companions did not impose an expensive burden upon their brothers to support their work among them.
- Nor did we eat food from anyone free. To the contrary, by labor and toil night and day we were working so as not to impose an expensive burden upon any one of you. (2 Thessalonians 3:8)
