[English, provocative, seditious, rabble-rousing, stirring]

- Israel began inciting Yehowah God to jealousy with strange gods.
- They began inciting him to jealousy with strange gods. With detestable things they kept offending him. (Deuteronomy 32:16)
- On the journey home Caleb's daughter began inciting him, asking him for a field of his as a possession for her.
- And it came about that when she was going home, she kept inciting him to ask a field from her father. Then she clapped her hands while upon the ass. At this Caleb said to her; What do you want? (Joshua 15:18)
- And it came about that while she was going home, she kept inciting him to ask a field from her father. Then she clapped her hands while upon the ass. At this Caleb said to her; What do you want? (Judges 1:14)
- Israel kept offending Yehowah God inciting him to jealousy with their many graven images and high places.
- And they kept offending him with their high places, and with their graven images they kept inciting him to jealousy. (Psalms 78:58)
- The representation of a hand indicates that Yehowah will help or give the Son of Man a hand of assistance to understand matters there in Judah that he cannot see, but that Yehowah does see. As a father may grab a child by a tuft of hair to impress upon him the importance and seriousness of a matter, so Yehowah now does to the Son of Man.
- Then he thrust out the representation of a hand and took me by a tuft of hair of my head, and a spirit carried me between the earth and the heavens and brought me to Jerusalem in the visions of God, to the entrance of the inner gate that is facing northward, where the dwelling place is of the symbol of jealousy that is inciting to jealousy. (Ezekiel 8:3)

- Then he told the gathered crowds, that they had brought Jesus to him as one who was inciting the people to revolt. Yet after he examined Jesus he found no such evidence, and so Pilate told them that he found no grounds for any of their charges.
- And said to them; You brought this man to me as one inciting the people to revolt, and, look! I examined him in front of you but found in this man no ground for the charges you are bringing against him. (Luke 23:14)
- Is it wise for Christians to try to incite Yehowah to jealousy? We are certainly not able to overpower him are we. He demands exclusive devotion to him and to his son, our espoused one, and anything less is spiritual harlotry and disloyalty. There is one God, and we must confine our godly devotion to this one, and to him alone.
- Or are we inciting Yehowah to jealousy? We are not stronger than he is, are we? (1 Corinthians 10:22)
