- Yehowah God told Moses that Pharaoh would not listen to his voice so that his miracles would be increased in Egypt.
- Then Yehowah said to Moses; Pharaoh will not listen to you men, in order for my miracles to be increased in the land of Egypt. (Exodus 11:9)
- The household of the chieftains increased in multitude.
- These who came in by names were the chieftains among their families, and the household itself of their forefathers increased in multitude. (1 Chronicles 4:38)
- When Hezekiah gave the word, the people increased their contributions of their firstfruits.
- And as soon as the word broke forth, the sons of Israel increased the firstfruits of the grain, new wine, and oil and honey and all the produce of the field, and the tenth of everything they brought in abundantly. (2 Chronicles 31:5)
- The wicked ones are at ease indefinitely, for they have increased their means of maintenance.
- Look! These are the wicked, who are at ease indefinitely. They have increased their means of maintenance. (Psalms 73:12)
- There exists one who is scattering, and yet is being increased.
- There exists the one that is scattering and yet is being increased, also the one that is keeping back from what is right, but it results only in want. (Proverbs 11:24)
- The congregator increased in wisdom more than anyone prior to him in Jerusalem, and he saw a great deal of wisdom and knowledge.
- I, even I, spoke with my heart, saying; Look! I myself have greatly increased in wisdom more than anyone that happened to

be before me in Jerusalem, and my own heart saw a great deal of wisdom and knowledge. (Ecclesiastes 1:16)

- And I became greater and increased more than anyone that happened to be before me in Jerusalem. Moreover, my own wisdom remained mine. (Ecclesiastes 2:9)
- Therefore Paul was not boasting about himself outside of his assigned boundaries, or over someone else's labors in the spreading true Christianity. The Corinthians were his labor in the Lord, and he wanted them to respect him, and his work among them, so that it might grow throughout their area, as their own faith increased.
- No, we are not boasting outside our assigned boundaries in the labors of someone else, but we entertain hope that, as your faith is being increased, we may be made great among you with reference to our territory. Then we will abound still more. (2 Corinthians 10:15)
- Anointed Christians have been brought forth according to the foreknowledge of the Father, Yehowah God, and by being sanctified by means of his Holy Spirit. The purpose of his giving them his spirit of anointing, is to make them obedient to his commands and ways, and for cleansing them from sin through the blood of the Christ.
- To all such called ones Peter now wishes for them to receive undeserved kindness and peace from Yehowah God in full measure, as part of his greetings to them.
- According to the foreknowledge of God the Father, with sanctification by the spirit, for the purpose of their being obedient and sprinkled with the blood of Jesus Christ. May undeserved kindness and peace be increased to you. (1 Peter 1:2)
- Peter asks his God to extend or increase to them undeserved kindness and peace through an accurate knowledge of truth about Yehowah God and his son Jesus Christ. This knowledge comes from the Bible record and also through his Holy Spirit which enlightens anointed Christians.
- May undeserved kindness and peace be increased to you by an accurate knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord. (2 Peter 1:2)

- Jude extends his wish to these called ones that the mercy and peace and love of their spiritual Father, Yehowah God may be increased to them all who are in union with him through the Holy Spirit which is dwelling within them.
- May mercy and peace and love be increased to you. (Jude 1:2)
