

## ~INDULGE (28)

[English, spoil, treat, pamper, pander to, make a fuss of, coddle,  
Opposite of, **deny**]

- The people gathered together and wept over the seeming loss of one tribe in Israel and they **indulged** in a great deal of weeping over this.
- Consequently the people came to Bethel and kept sitting there before the true God until the evening and continued to raise their voice and **indulge** in a great deal of weeping. (**Judges 21:2**)
- Jeremiah asked how can an able-bodied man **indulge** in complaints because of his sinfulness.
- How can a living man **indulge** in complaints, an able-bodied man on account of his sin? (**Lamentations 3:39**)
- Paul told the Corinthian Christians that he did not **indulge** in any lightness or humor, but his yes meant yes and his no meant no.
- Well, when I had such an intention, I did not **indulge** in any lightness, did I? Or what things I purpose, do I purpose them according to the flesh, that with me there should be Yes, Yes and No, No? (**2 Corinthians 1:17**)
