

### ~INDULGING (46)

[English, spoiling, treating, pampering, pandering to, making a fuss of, coddling, Opposite of, **denying**]

- Wickedness will not provide escape, to anyone **indulging** in it.
- There is no man having power over the spirit to restrain the spirit, neither is there any power of control in the day of death, nor is there any discharge in the war. And wickedness will provide no escape for those **indulging** in it. (**Ecclesiastes 8:8**)
- If ones charming words are not well received by the hearer then there is no advantage to **indulging** in the tongue.
- If the serpent bites when no charming results, then there is no advantage to the one **indulging** in the tongue. (**Ecclesiastes 10:11**)
- Those **indulging** in collections of sentences are compared to nails driven in, firmly seated and affixed, for they come from one shepherd, Yehowah God.
- The words of the wise ones are like oxgoads, and just like nails driven in are those **indulging** in collections of sentences, they have been given from one shepherd. (**Ecclesiastes 12:11**)
- Peter spoke of certain wicked ones within the congregation who **indulged** with unrestrained delight in their deceptive teachings at Christians gatherings.
- Wronging themselves as a reward for wrongdoing. They consider luxurious living in the daytime a pleasure. They are spots and blemishes, **indulging** with unrestrained delight in their deceptive teachings while feasting together with you. (**2 Peter 2:13**)
- Jude spoke of those who are **indulging** in dreams and defiling the flesh and who have no respect for glorious ones.
- In like manner, notwithstanding, these men, too, **indulging** in dreams, are defiling the flesh and disregarding lordship and speaking abusively of glorious ones. (**Jude 1:8**)
