## ~INEXPERIENCED (150)

[English, green, inexpert, raw, new, innocent, untried, untested, unproven, Opposite of, seasoned, veteran]

- The Law of Yehowah God is life promoting, making the inexperienced ones act wisely.
- The Law of Yehowah is perfect, bringing back the soul. The reminder of Yehowah is trustworthy, making the inexperienced one wise. (Psalms 19:7)
- The Psalmist showed that Yehowah guards the inexperienced ones, and that when the Psalmist himself was impoverished, Yehowah saved him.
- Yehowah is guarding the inexperienced ones. I was impoverished, and he proceeded to save even me. (Psalms 116:6)
- The very disclosure of Yehowah God's word gives light of understanding, making the inexperienced ones understand.
- The very disclosure of your words gives light, making the inexperienced ones understand. (Psalms 119:130)
- The purpose of the Proverbs is to give to the inexperienced one shrewdness, knowledge and thinking ability.
- To give to the **inexperienced** ones shrewdness, to a young man knowledge and thinking ability. (**Proverbs 1:4**)
- The congregator asks how long the inexperienced ones will revel in their inexperience, and how long ridiculers will keep desiring outright ridicule, and how long the stupid ones will continue hating knowledge.
- How long will you inexperienced ones keep loving inexperience, and how long must you ridiculers desire for yourselves outright ridicule, and how long will you stupid ones keep hating knowledge? (Proverbs 1:22)

- The rebelliousness of the inexperienced ones is what will kill them.
- For the renegading of the inexperienced ones is what will kill them, and the easygoingness of the stupid is what will destroy them. (Proverbs 1:32)
- Solomon observed among the sons of mankind for an inexperienced young man in want of heart.
- That I might peer upon the inexperienced ones. I was interested in discerning among the sons a young man in want of heart. (Proverbs 7:7)
- The congregator calls for the inexperienced ones to understand shrewdness, and for the stupid ones to acquire heart.
- O inexperienced ones, understand shrewdness, and you stupid ones, understand heart. (Proverbs 8:5)
- The prostitute calls for the inexperienced ones to turn aside to her dwelling, all those in want of heart.
- Whoever is inexperienced, let him turn aside here. Whoever is in want of heart, she has said to him. (Proverbs 9:4)
- Whoever is inexperienced, let him turn aside here. And whoever is in want of heart, she has also said to him. (Proverbs 9:16)
- The congregator calls for his son to leave the inexperienced ones, and thus keep living, for life is a learning experience and a discipline in love.
- Leave the inexperienced ones and keep living, and walk straight in the way of understanding. (Proverbs 9:6)
- Anyone inexperienced put faith in every spoken word, but a shrewd man considers his steps.
- Anyone inexperienced puts faith in every word, but the shrewd one considers his steps. (Proverbs 14:15)
- The inexperienced ones will take possession of foolishness, but the shrewd one wears his knowledge like a headdress of honor.

- The inexperienced ones will certainly take possession of foolishness, but the shrewd ones will bear knowledge as a headdress. (Proverbs 14:18)
- A ridiculer should be struck, so that inexperienced ones watching may become shrewd. There should be a reproving of the understanding one, so that he may discern knowledge.
- The ridiculer you should strike, that the inexperienced one may become shrewd, and there should be a reproving of the understanding one, that he may discern knowledge. (Proverbs 19:25)
- By the laying on of a fine upon the ridiculer, the inexperienced one becomes wise.
- By the laying of a fine on the ridiculer the inexperienced becomes wise, and by ones giving insight to a wise person he gets knowledge. (Proverbs 21:11)
- A shrewd man upon seeing an approaching calamity hides himself, but the inexperienced one rushes into it, and so must suffer the penalty.
- Shrewd is the one that has seen the calamity and proceeds to conceal himself, but the inexperienced have passed along and must suffer the penalty. (Proverbs 22:3)
- The shrewd one that has seen the calamity has concealed himself, the inexperienced that have passed along have suffered the penalty. (Proverbs 27:12)
- Therefore, we should not be hypocritical people, but we should pray for one another and make sacrifices in behalf of ones who may be inexperienced. We should always seek the best for all our brothers.
- And that is how you will do on the seventh day in the month because of any man making a mistake and because of any inexperienced one, and you people must make atonement for the House. (Ezekiel 45:20)
