[English, imposed, exacted, meted out, wreaked, caused]

- Chedorlaomer **inflicted** defeats upon five kings of Canaan.
- And in the fourteenth year Chedorlaomer came, and also the kings who were with him, and they **inflicted** defeats on the Rephaim in Ashterothkarnaim, and the Zuzim in Ham, and the Emim in Shavehkiriathaim. (**Genesis 14:5**)
- Hence he returned to get healed at Jezreel from the wounds that they had **inflicted** upon him at Ramah when he fought Hazael the king of Syria. As for Azariah the son of Jehoram the king of Judah, he went down to see Jehoram the son of Ahab in Jezreel, for he was sick. (**2 Chronicles 22:6**)
