

~INJURIOUSLY (38)

[English, harmfully, damagingly, detrimentally, adversely, deleteriously, ruinously, Opposite of, harmlessly]

- Some of the Jews who listened to Paul preach went to hardening themselves and speaking **injuriously** about the Way of the truth.
- But when some went on hardening themselves and not believing, speaking **injuriously** about The Way before the multitude, he withdrew from them and separated the disciples from them, daily giving talks in the school auditorium of Tyrannus. (**Acts of Apostles 19:9**)
- Paul apologized to the High Priest for speaking **injuriously** for he did not know it was him.
- And Paul said; Brothers, I did not know he was High Priest. For it is written, You must not speak **injuriously** of a ruler of your people. (**Acts of Apostles 23:5**)
- Paul counseled Timothy that slaves must show due honor to their owners so that the word of God might not be spoken of **injuriously**.
- Let as many as are slaves under a yoke keep on considering their owners worthy of full honor, that the name of God and the teaching may never be spoken of **injuriously**. (**1 Timothy 6:1**)
- Paul's counsel to Titus was for Christians to speak **injuriously** to no one.
- To speak **injuriously** of no one, not to be belligerent, to be reasonable, exhibiting all mildness toward all men. (**Titus 3:2**)
