[English, blamelessness, purity, virtue, incorruptibility, virtuousness, Opposite of, **guilt**]

- Surely it is in vain that I have cleansed my heart and that I wash my hands in **innocence** itself. (**Psalms 73:13**)
- Daniel told the king Darius that the lions had not harmed him because he stood before his God in **innocence**.
- My own God sent his angel and shut the mouth of the lions, and they have not brought me to ruin, forasmuch as before him **innocence** itself was found in me, and also before you, O king, no hurtful act have I done. (**Daniel 6:22**)
