~INQUIRING (75)

[English, inquisitive, interested, curious, questioning, analytical]

- Judah went inquiring of the men of her place about the temple prostitute he had encountered there.
- And he went inquiring of the men of her place, saying; Where is that temple prostitute in Enaim along the road? But they kept saying; No temple prostitute has ever been in this place. (Genesis 38:21)
- Everyone in Israel inquiring of Yehowah God went to inquiring of Moses at his tent outside of the camp of Israel.
- As for Moses, he proceeded to take his tent away and he pitched it outside the camp, far away from the camp, and he called it a tent of meeting. And it occurred that everyone inquiring of Yehowah would go out to the tent of meeting, which was outside the camp. (Exodus 33:7)
- The men of his village went to inquiring, as to who had done this thing to Baal.
- And they began to say one to another; Who has done this thing? And they went inquiring and seeking. Finally they said; Gideon the son of Joash is the one that has done this thing. (Judges 6:29)
- The Psalmist bemoaned that his place of flight had perished from him, and no one was inquiring for him for good.
- Look to the right hand and see that there is no one giving any recognition to me. My place for flight has perished from me, there is no one inquiring for my soul. (Psalms 142:4)
- Yehowah then shows them, that they keep following their own wooden idol god, that they have made for themselves, inquiring of it, rather than of him, the God of all true prophecy. Also, rather than following his rod or staff for guiding his people, which is the Holy Bible, that they make staffs for themselves, following human appointed teachers, and human inspired teachings of mere men.

- Of their wooden idol my own people keep inquiring, and their own hand staff keeps telling them, because the very spirit of fornication has caused them to wander off, and by fornication they go out from under their God. (Hosea 4:12)
- Jesus knew that they were wanting to question him about this, so he asked then, why they were inquiring among themselves about his previous statement, of a little while, before he would leave them and then see them again.
- Jesus knew they were wanting to question him, so he said to them; Are you inquiring among yourselves over this, because I said; In a little while you will not behold me, and, again, in a little while you will see me? (John 16:19)
- So the military commander took the young man by the hand and withdrew to begin inquiring of him in private, asking the man, what do you have to report to me?
- The military commander took him by the hand and withdrew and began inquiring privately; What is it you have to report to me? (Acts of Apostles 23:19)
