## ~INSIGNIFICANT (107)

[English, unimportant, irrelevant, not important, of no consequence, immaterial, inconsequential, not worth mentioning, trivial, minor, Opposite of, significant]

- Saul felt that he and his family were among the most insignificant men of his tribe of Benjamin.
- At this Saul answered and said; Am I not a Benjaminite of the smallest of the tribes of Israel, and my family the most insignificant of all the families of the tribe of Benjamin? So why have you spoken to me a thing like this? (1 Samuel 9:21)
- The Psalmist viewed himself as contemptible and insignificant, and tried always to keep Yehowah God's orders.
- I am insignificant and contemptible. Your orders I have not forgotten. (Psalms 119:141)
- Yehowah has a serious matter, a legal case, against his people, and he will not be trifled with. Their looking to mere men, numbers and human strength, to Egypt, is a serious wrong.
- Dehovah's Witnesses trusting in sheer numbers and glorifying their powerful organization, comparing it to large worldly nations, is surely a reason for shame, yet they treat it as insignificant, yet it will cause them much humiliation. Yehowah showed then, that trusting in the world and its strengths was disloyalty to him, and would not bring salvation.
- Why do you treat as very insignificant the changing of your way? Of Egypt, too, you will become ashamed, just as you became ashamed of Assyria. (Jeremiah 2:36)
- The Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses are all anointed ones, but they have non-anointed ones who do the real work of running the organization, because the others are quite old. These insignificant ones, non-anointed men, have been charged since 1992 C.E, with providing the organization with spiritual food. However, they have found that the ditches are empty, there is no new spiritual food or understanding, there is no water!

- And their majestic ones themselves have sent their insignificant ones for water. They have come to the ditches. They have found no water. They have returned with their vessels empty. They have been put to shame and have been disappointed, and they have covered their head. (Jeremiah 14:3)
- What a joyous day that will be, after the destruction of all of false religion, when Yehowah frees his people from the wicked dominion of earth's rulers. Their hearts will be filled with thanksgiving and their voices with laughter, as they see Yehowah smite their heavy-handed oppressors a final blow.
- Then Yehowah will gather and bless his people in a cleansed earth, and they will multiply and become many, filling the earth with righteous offspring. They will not become insignificant, for then true worship will take control of all the earth, and the way of Yehowah will become firmly established.
- And from them there will certainly go forth thanksgiving, and the sound of those who are laughing. And I will multiply them, and they will not become few, and I will make them heavy in number, and they will not become insignificant. (Jeremiah 30:19)
- Now Yehowah calls for a sword to awake against his own shepherd, even against the able-bodied man who is Yehowah God's own associate, the Messiah, his son, Jesus Christ. This one will be struck, this fine shepherd, and then the sheep of his flock will be scattered about. Then Yehowah God will certainly turn back his hand upon those of his sheep who are insignificant.
- O sword, awake against my shepherd, even against the ablebodied man who is my associate, is the utterance of Yehowah of armies. Strike the shepherd, and let those of the flock be scattered, and I shall certainly turn my hand back upon those who are insignificant. (Zechariah 13:7)
- Micah prophesied that Bethlehem, though a small or insignificant city among the cities of Judah would be blessed with the birth of the Messiah in her midst. From within her would come the governing one, who would come to shepherd and rule over the people of Israel.
- And you, O Bethlehem of the land of Judah, are by no means the most insignificant city among the governor's of Judah, for out of you will come forth a governing one, who will shepherd my

people, Israel. (Matthew 2:6)
