## ~INSOLENTLY (34)

[English, impudently, impertinently, rudely, audaciously, disrespectfully, Opposite of, respectfully]

- In Jesus parable the cultivators laid hold of the master's slaves and treated them insolently.
- But the rest, laying hold of his slaves, treated them insolently and killed them. (Matthew 22:6)
- Jesus prophesied about himself that he would be delivered up to the men of the nations and treated insolently.
- For instance, he will be delivered up to men of the nations and will be made fun of and be treated insolently and spit upon. (Luke 18:32)
- In Iconium Paul and his companions were treated insolently by the crowds led by the Jews and they pelted them with stones.
- Now when a violent attempt took place on the part of both people of the nations and Jews with their rulers, to treat them insolently and pelt them with stones. (Acts of Apostles 14:5)
- After being treated insolently and suffering at the hands of bad men, Paul mustered up boldness to again speak the Good News.
- But how, after we had first suffered and been insolently treated, just as you know, in Philippi, we mustered up boldness by means of our God to speak to you the Good News of God with a great deal of struggling. (1 Thessalonians 2:2)
