~INSOLENT (75)

[English, impudent, impertinent, rude, audacious, disrespectful, cheeky, Opposite of, respectful]

- Abimelech proceeded to hire idle and insolent men to accompany him.
- Then they gave him seventy pieces of silver from the house of Baal-berith, and with them Abimelech proceeded to hire idle and insolent men, that they might accompany him. (Judges 9:4)
- In the city where this King rules, there will be no insolent ones, who have not come to understand the pure language of truth. All there will come to speak this pure language with confidence and poise.
- No insolent people will you see, a people too deep in language to listen to, of a stammering tongue without your understanding. (Isaiah 33:19)
- Jehovah's Witnesses and all the rest of Christendom is just such a people, insolent of face and hard of heart. They have the Bible and they purport to follow it, but among them the things that the Bible counsels against abound. Christendom lost God's favor in 1919 C.E, and Jehovah's Witnesses gained his favor at that time. He expressed this by giving them the worldwide preaching work and supporting it among them for ninety-one years.
- And the sons insolent of face and hard of heart, I am sending you to them, and you must say to them, This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said. (Ezekiel 2:4)
- Among her number, her prophets were insolent men, filled with treachery. Her very priests profaned what was holy, and their teachings did violence to the Law Covenant, that they were sworn to uphold.
- Her prophets were insolent, were men of treachery. Her priests themselves profaned what was holy, they did violence to the Law. (Zephaniah 3:4)
- They develop bad qualities, because they are haters of God and his righteous way, insolent men. Rather than learning to exercise

godly qualities like brotherly love, warmth and compassion, and love for the truth and mercy, they develop wicked ones, like the ones mentioned above.

- Backbiters, haters of God, insolent, haughty, self-assuming, inventors of injurious things, disobedient to parents. (Romans 1:30)
- Paul now refers to his own wicked course of the past, when he persecuted the congregation of God, and he blasphemed those who are now his Christian brothers in the faith, for he was an insolent man. Truly then, he was an insolent man. Nevertheless, he was shown mercy, because at the time he was ignorant of God's will and purpose for him and all others, and thus, did not see the value of the Christ within God's grand purpose.
- Although formerly I was a blasphemer and a persecutor and an insolent man. Nevertheless, I was shown mercy, because I was ignorant and acted with a lack of faith. (1 Timothy 1:13)
