~ISCARIOT (26)

(Is-car'i-ot) [from Hebrew, possibly, Man From Kerioth]

- The designation for the traitor apostle Judas, and his father Simon, that sets him apart from the other apostle also named Judas.
- Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who later betrayed him. (Matthew 10:4)
- And Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who turned traitor. (Luke 6:16)
- He was, in fact, speaking of Judas the son of Simon Iscariot, for this one was going to betray him, although one of the twelve. (John 6:71)
- If Iscariot means, as is most commonly thought, Man From Kerioth, then it likely identifies Simon and his son as being from the Judean town of Kerioth-hezron.
- And Hazor-hadattah and Kerioth-hezron, that is to say; Hazor. (Joshua 15:25)
