

~ISCARIOT (26)

(Is-car'i-ot) [from Hebrew, possibly, Man From Kerioth]

- The designation for the traitor apostle Judas, and his father Simon, that sets him apart from the other apostle also named Judas.
- Simon the Cananaean, and Judas **Iscariot**, who later betrayed him. (**Matthew 10:4**)
- And Judas the son of James, and Judas **Iscariot**, who turned traitor. (**Luke 6:16**)
- He was, in fact, speaking of Judas the son of Simon **Iscariot**, for this one was going to betray him, although one of the twelve. (**John 6:71**)
- If **Iscariot** means, as is most commonly thought, **Man From Kerioth**, then it likely identifies Simon and his son as being from the Judean town of Kerioth-hezron.
- And Hazor-hadattah and Kerioth-hezron, that is to say; Hazor. (**Joshua 15:25**)
