~JANOAH 2 (28)

(Ja-no'ah) [from a root that means rest, settle down]

- A city in the ten-tribe kingdom taken by Tiglath-pileser III during Pekah's reign, circa 778-759 B.C.E. Its inhabitants were deported to Assyria.
- In the days of Pekah the king of Israel, Tiglath-pileser the king of Assyria came in and proceeded to take Ijon and Abel-bethmaacah and Janoah and Kedesh and Hazor and Gilead and Galilee, all the land of Naphtali, and to carry them into exile in Assyria. (2 Kings 15:29)
- The exact location of Janoah is uncertain. Although some identify it with Yanouh, about 10 kilometers (6 miles) East of Tyre, this location is considered to be too far West of the other cities listed at;
- In the days of Pekah the king of Israel, Tiglath-pileser the king of Assyria came in and proceeded to take Ijon and Abel-beth-maacah and Janoah and Kedesh and Hazor and Gilead and Galilee, all the land of Naphtali, and to carry them into exile in Assyria. (2 Kings 15:29)
- Most scholars favor Tell en-Na`meh, about 10 kilometers (6 miles) Northeast of Kedesh in Galilee.
