## ~JEHU 2 (62) (Je'hu) [possibly, Yehowah Is He]

- A prophet, the son of Hanani. He foretold the destruction of the house of Baasha, king of Israel.
- The word of Yehowah now came to Jehu the son of Hanani against Baasha, saying; (1 Kings 16:1)
- Inasmuch as I raised you up out of the dust that I might constitute you leader over my people Israel, but you went walking in the way of Jeroboam and so caused my people Israel to sin by offending me with their sins. (1 Kings 16:2)
- Here I am making a clean sweep after Baasha and after his house, and I shall certainly constitute his house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat. (1 Kings 16:3)
- Anyone of Baasha that is dying in the city the dogs will eat, and anyone of his that is dying in the field the fowls of the heavens will eat. (1 Kings 16:4)
- And also by means of Jehu the son of Hanani the prophet, Yehowah's word itself had come against Baasha and his house, both because of all the badness that he committed in the eyes of Yehowah by offending him with the work of his hands, that it might become like the house of Jeroboam, and because he struck him down. (1 Kings 16:7)
- Thus Zimri annihilated the whole house of Baasha, according to the word of Yehowah that he had spoken against Baasha by means of Jehu the prophet. (1 Kings 16:12)
- More than 33 years later, a prophet by the same name, and hence, perhaps the same person, reproved King Jehoshaphat of Judah for his friendship with and assistance to wicked King Ahab of Israel.
- Then Jehoshaphat the king of Judah returned in peace to his own house at Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 19:1)
- Jehu the son of Hanani the visionary now went out before him and said to King Jehoshaphat; Is it to the wicked that help is to

be given, and is it for those hating Yehowah that you should have love? And for this there is indignation against you from the person of Yehowah. (2 Chronicles 19:2)

- Nevertheless, there are good things that have been found with you, because you have cleared out the sacred poles from the land and you have prepared your heart to search for the true God. (2 Chronicles 19:3)
- As for the rest of the affairs of Jehoshaphat, the first and the last, there they are written among the words of Jehu the son of Hanani, which were inserted in the Book of the Kings of Israel. (2 Chronicles 20:34)
- Jehoshaphat's history is said to be written, among the words of Jehu the son of Hanani, which were inserted in the Book of the Kings of Israel.
