~JESHANAH (28) (Jesh'a-nah) [Old [Town]]

- A place mentioned along with Mizpah as indicating the location of the stone that Samuel set up and called, Ebenezer.
- Then Samuel took a stone and set it between Mizpah and Jeshanah and began to call its name Ebenezer. Accordingly he said; Till now Yehowah has helped us. (1 Samuel 7:12)
- Jeshanah was one of the cities captured by Judean King Abijah,
 980-978 B.C.E, from Jeroboam the king of Israel.
- And Abijah kept chasing after Jeroboam and got to capture cities from him, Bethel and its dependent towns, and Jeshanah and its dependent towns, and Ephrain and its dependent towns. (2 Chronicles 13:19)
- It is considered to be identical with the <u>Isana</u> referred to by Josephus as the site of Herod the Greats victory over General Pappus. [Jewish Antiquities, XIV, 458, xv, 12]
- The name Isana seems to be preserved in Burj el-Isaneh, about 8 kilometers (5 miles) North-Northeast of Bethel. This place has therefore been suggested as a possible identification for ancient leshanah.
