

**~JESHIMON 2 (29)**  
**(Je-shi'mon) [Desert]**

- A region near Ziph, situated North of the Wilderness of Maon. It would appear that **Jeshimon** included part of the Wilderness of Judah and lay a few miles Southeast of Hebron. In this area of naked, chalky hills, David and his men hid from King Saul.
- Later the men of Ziph went up to Saul at Gibeah, saying; Is not David concealing himself close by us in the places difficult to approach at Horesh, on the hill of Hachilah, which is to the right side of **Jeshimon**? (**1 Samuel 23:19**)
- So they rose up and went to Ziph ahead of Saul, while David and his men were in the wilderness of Maon in the Arabah to the south of **Jeshimon**. (**1 Samuel 23:24**)
- In time the men of Ziph came to Saul at Gibeah, saying; Is not David concealing himself on the hill of Hachilah, facing **Jeshimon**? (**1 Samuel 26:1**)
- And Saul took up camping on the hill of Hachilah, which faces **Jeshimon**, by the road, while David was dwelling in the wilderness. And he got to see that Saul had come after him into the wilderness. (**1 Samuel 26:3**)
