- An inspired book of the Hebrew Scriptures written by, Joel the son of Pethuel.
- The word of Yehowah that occurred to Joel the son of Pethuel (Joel 1:1)
- Virtually nothing is known about this prophet's life. From his references to Judah, Jerusalem, and Yehowah's house there, it may be inferred that he prophesied in Judah and perhaps resided in Jerusalem.

Implies that he wrote his book after Yehowah's great victory on behalf of King Jehoshaphat. But the exact period involved is in question.

## " Time Of Writing

- Scholars variously assign the book of Joel dates from before 800 B.C.E. to about 400 B.C.E. Regarding their arguments in favor of a late or an early composition for the book, The International Standard Bible Encyclopaedia [edited by James Orr, 1960, Vol. III, p. 1690] observes:
- Many of the arguments adduced are of a negative kind, i.e. consideration of what the prophet does not mention or refer to, including the Chaldeans, the Assyrians, a Judean king, and the tentribe kingdom, and the argument from silence is notoriously precarious.
- Similarly, whether Joel quoted other prophets or was quoted by them cannot be established with certainty. A date after the Babylonian exile would be indicated if;

- And he proceeded to say; Yehowah, out of Zion he will roar, and out of Jerusalem he will give forth his voice, and the pasture

grounds of the shepherds must go to mourning, and the summit of Carmel must dry up. (Amos 1:2)

- May have quoted from Joel. This would mean that Joel wrote his book no later than the time of Uzziah.
- The words of Amos, who happened to be among the sheep raisers from Tekoa, which he visioned concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah the king of Judah and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, the king of Israel, two years before the earthquake. (Amos 1:1)
- Perhaps about 820 B.C.E. Though not conclusive, the place occupied by the book of Joel in the Hebrew canon between Hosea and Amos seems to favor the earlier period.

## · · Authenticity

- The Jews did not question the canonicity of the book of Joel but placed it second among the minor prophets. It also harmonizes completely with the rest of the Scriptures, as is evident from the numerous parallels between Joel and other Bible books.
- It is a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick gloom, like light of dawn spread out upon the mountains. There is a people numerous and mighty, one like it has not been made to exist from the indefinite past, and after it there will be none again to the years of generation after generation. (Joel 2:2)
- The great day of Yehowah is near. It is near, and there is a hurrying of it very much. The sound of the day of Yehowah is bitter. There a mighty man is letting out a cry. (Zephaniah 1:14)
- That day is a day of fury, a day of distress and of anguish, a day of storm and of desolation, a day of darkness and of gloominess, a day of clouds and of thick gloom. (Zephaniah 1:15)
