~JOGBEHAH (35) (Jog'be-hah)

- One of the fortified cities with stone flock pens that were built or rebuilt by the Gadites before their crossing the Jordan to assist in the conquest of Canaan.
- And the sons of Gad proceeded to build Dibon and Ataroth and Aroer. (Numbers 32:34)
- And Atroth-shophan and Jazer and Jogbehah. (Numbers 32:35)
- And Beth-nimrah and Beth-haran, cities with fortifications, and stone flock pens. (Numbers 32:36)
- At a later period Judge Gideon's forces passed Jogbehah prior to their surprise attack on the Midianite camp at Karkor.
- Now Zebah and Zalmunna were in Karkor, and their camps with them, about fifteen thousand being all who were left over out of the entire camp of the Easterners, and those already fallen were a hundred and twenty thousand men who used to draw the sword. (Judges 8:10)
- And Gideon continued on up by the way of those residing in tents to the east of Nobah and Jogbehah and began to strike the camp while the camp happened to be off guard. (Judges 8:11)
- Jogbehah is identified with el-Jubeihat, situated about 1,050 meters (3,440 feet) above sea level and some 10 kilometers (6 miles) Northwest of modern `Amman, Rabbah.
