~JOKTAN (50) (Jok'tan)

- A descendant of Eber, brother of Peleg, and father of 13 sons.
- And to Eber there were two sons born. The name of the one was Peleg, because in his days the earth was divided, and the name of his brother was Joktan. (Genesis 10:25)
- And Joktan became father to Almodad and Sheleph and Hazarmaveth and Jerah. (Genesis 10:26)
- And Hadoram and Uzal and Diklah. (Genesis 10:27)
- And Obal and Abimael and Sheba. (Genesis 10:28)
- And Ophir and Havilah and Jobab, all these were the sons of Joktan. (Genesis 10:29)
- And to Eber two sons were born. The name of the one was Peleg, because in his days the earth was divided, and the name of his brother was Joktan. (1 Chronicles 1:19)
- As for Joktan, he became father to Almodad and Sheleph and Hazarmaveth and Jerah (1 Chronicles 1:20)
- And Hadoram and Uzal and Diklah. (1 Chronicles 1:21)
- And Obal and Abimael and Sheba. (1 Chronicles 1:22)
- And Ophir and Havilah and Jobab, all these were the sons of Joktan. (1 Chronicles 1:23)
- The names of some of Joktan's descendants appear to have survived at various places in South and Southwest Arabia. It has been suggested that Joktan was the progenitor of the original peoples of Arabia, as distinguished from the tribes descended from the sons of Abraham by Hagar and Keturah.
- The geographic limits of the territory inhabited by Joktan's descendants are Biblically described as running from Mesha as far as Sephar.

- And their place of dwelling came to extend from Mesha as far as Sephar, the mountainous region of the East. (Genesis 10:30)
- But the exact area covered is uncertain.
