## ~JOTBATHAH (23)

(Jot'ba-thah) [from a root that means go well, prove satisfactory, do good]

- A well-watered wilderness encampment of the Israelites.
- Next they pulled away from Hor-haggidgad and went camping in Jotbathah. (Numbers 33:33)
- Later they pulled away from Jotbathah and went camping in Abronah. (Numbers 33:34)
- From there they pulled away for Gudgodah, and from Gudgodah for Jotbathah, a land of torrent valleys running with water. (Deuteronomy 10:7)
- Its exact location cannot be determined. However, `Ain Tabah, `En Yotvata, located in a swampy depression about 40 kilometers (25 miles) North of Ezion-geber, has been suggested as a possible identification.
