

~JOTBATHAH (23)

(Jot'ba-thah) [from a root that means go well, prove satisfactory, do good]

- A well-watered wilderness encampment of the Israelites.
- Next they pulled away from Hor-haggidgad and went camping in **Jotbathah**. (**Numbers 33:33**)
- Later they pulled away from **Jotbathah** and went camping in Abironah. (**Numbers 33:34**)
- From there they pulled away for Gudgodah, and from Gudgodah for **Jotbathah**, a land of torrent valleys running with water. (**Deuteronomy 10:7**)
- Its exact location cannot be determined. However, **`Ain Tabah**, **`En Yotvata**, located in a swampy depression about 40 kilometers (25 miles) North of Ezion-geber, has been suggested as a possible identification.
