- Men raised up by Yehowah to deliver his people prior to the period of Israel's human kings were known as judges.
- So Yehowah would raise up judges, and they would save them out of the hand of their pillagers. (Judges 2:16)
- Moses, as mediator of the Law covenant and God-appointed leader, judged Israel for 40 years. But the period of Judges, as usually viewed, began with Othniel, sometime after the death of Joshua, and extended until Samuel the prophet. Samuel is not usually counted among the Judges. So the period of the Judges extended about 300 years.
- So Yehowah would raise up judges, and they would save them out of the hand of their pillagers. (Judges 2:16)
- All that during about four hundred and fifty years. And after these things he gave them judges until Samuel the prophet. (Acts of Apostles 13:20)
- The judges were selected and appointed by Yehowah from various tribes of Israel. Between Joshua and Samuel, 12 judges, not including Deborah, are named, as follows;

The exact area over which each of the judges exercised jurisdiction and the dates of their judgeships cannot in every case be determined. Some may have judged contemporaneously in different sections of Israel, and there were periods of oppression intervening. also judges of Israel under individual names.
