## ~JUSTUS 3 (19)

(Jus'tus) [from Latin meaning, Just, Upright, Righteous]

- A Jewish fellow worker of the apostle Paul. Justus, also called Jesus, was one of those who strengthened Paul during his first imprisonment in Rome and who sent along his greetings to the Colossians.
- Aristarchus my fellow captive sends you his greetings, and so does Mark the cousin of Barnabas, concerning whom you received commands to welcome him if ever he comes to you. (Colossians 4:10)
- And Jesus who is called Justus, these being of those circumcised. Only these are my fellow workers for the kingdom of God, and these very ones have become a strengthening aid to me. (Colossians 4:11)
