(Kab'ze-el) [God Has Collected]

- A city in the southern part of Judah.
- And the cities at the extremity of the tribe of the sons of Judah toward the boundary of Edom in the south came to be Kabzeel and Eder and Jagur. (Joshua 15:21)
- It is tentatively identified with Khirbet Hora, Horvat Hur, about 10 kilometers (6 miles) East-Northeast of Beer-sheba. The Hebrew text of,
